I am writing to express strong support for SB79/HB163, which would allow out-of-state RV dealers to display—but not sell—their products at the Ocean City RV & Van Lifestyle Show in Worcester County. This amendment offers a tremendous opportunity to drive economic growth, expand tourism, and better showcase Maryland as a leading destination for outdoor recreation enthusiasts.

Ocean City is a nationally recognized tourist destination that attracts visitors from across the country. In just two years, the OC RV Show has drawn attendees from more than 15 states, including Maryland, Delaware, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and New Jersey, as well as visitors traveling from Florida, Texas, and Connecticut. By allowing out-of-state dealers to display a broader range of RV brands, we can significantly increase the event's appeal and drive even greater attendance—benefiting Maryland dealers through increased exposure and sales opportunities.

Currently, Maryland's RV dealership network does not fully represent the wide array of manufacturers on the market. Major brands such as Airstream, Scamp, Oliver, ATC, and RoadTrek are not available through Maryland dealers. While online research and virtual tours have become common tools for consumers, nothing compares to the experience of exploring an RV in person and engaging directly with manufacturer representatives. Expanding the product selection at the OC RV Show will give consumers a more comprehensive view of their options and empower them to make more confident purchasing decisions.

This diversity of products will not only attract more visitors but will also directly benefit Maryland dealers. More foot traffic at the event means greater visibility and more opportunities for Maryland dealers to connect with potential buyers—both in and out of state. Many RV buyers choose to store their vehicles near their vacation destinations, and with over 18 campgrounds within a 60-mile radius of Ocean City, Maryland dealers are well-positioned to capitalize on this demand. This increased activity can lead to more sales and long-term customer relationships.

Worcester County currently lacks any RV dealerships, with the closest Maryland dealer located 90 miles away. Six of the ten nearest dealerships are located within 45 miles of Ocean City but are in neighboring states. This amendment helps address this market gap by allowing out-of-state dealers to display RVs, without conducting on-site sales, ensuring that all transactions comply with Maryland's tax, title, and registration requirements. As a result, Maryland will retain all state tax revenue while giving consumers access to a more diverse selection of RVs.

By enhancing the product variety at the OC RV Show, we create a more dynamic and attractive event that supports local businesses and strengthens Maryland's presence in the outdoor recreation industry. Over time, this increased interest can drive the development of new RV dealerships, repair shops, and related businesses in Worcester County, generating new jobs and stimulating local economic growth. The success of this show has the potential to position Maryland as a premier destination for RV enthusiasts and outdoor adventurers alike.

- Three renovations later, thanks to this House, it now boasts over 240,000 square feet, hosting over 110 events;
- Those events include the MSFA, MML, MACo, the MD Bar Assn., MD State Education Assn., to name a few;
- We also host over 20 competition-based events, i.e. cheerleaders, dance competitions, wrestling, volleyball and more;
- With the addition of Phase III, including 30,000 square feet of exhibit space and an additional 12,000 square feet of pre-function, it has made the venue much more conducive to host multiple events running simultaneously, such as this coming weekend when we will be hosting the Allegheny East Conference Youth Congress, as well as SPORTSWORX (GYMNASTICS EVENT);
- We also host consumer shows such as Bikefest, two car shows, the ever-growing ComicCon and more;
- Phase II brought us the Performing Arts Center, bringing entertainment from around the country and guests from around the region;
- Which brings us to the RV Show: So many of the above mentioned started small, we see this as a boon to not only Ocean City, but the surrounding area and State as well. I strongly and respectfully request that the committee provide Senate Bill 79 and House Bill 163 with a favorable report.

My name is Matt Libber, and I am the Legislative Committee Chair for the Maryland Tourism Coalition (MTC). I am writing to you today to express MTC's support for Senate Bill 79. The Maryland Tourism Coalition is a trade organization with members representing all areas of tourism in the State of Maryland. Our mission is to support businesses and organizations that cater to the tourism industry through education, networking, and advocacy. As such, MTC asks the committee to vote in favor of this bill.

This bill will provide much needed diversity of options for residents of the eastern shore interested in purchasing a recreational vehicle (RV). Currently there are limited options on the lower shore for residents to purchase a RV and require them to drive longer distances to find a dealer. This bill will allow dealers, mainly from Delaware, to display their vehicles during the Motor Home and Recreational Trailer show in Ocean City. Increasing the number of Maryland residents that own motor homes and RVs would have a positive impact on the tourism industry. It would lead to an increase in the use of the campgrounds around the state and the tourism-related businesses that exist around those campgrounds, including restaurants, retail stores, and state parks. Additionally, allowing out-of-state dealers to attend the RV show in Worcester County has the potential to bring more visitors to this show from outside the State of Maryland. This will provide additional tourism spending in the State. The RV show in Worcester County will likely be the closest show for residents in Delaware and the eastern shore of Virginia. Expanding the pool of dealers at this RV show makes it more attractive to potential attendees. This RV show occurs during the off-peak season for Ocean City, so an increase in attendance will be a welcome addition to the many businesses in Ocean City that would cater to the needs of these visitors, including hotels, restaurants, and retail shops.

This version of the bill contains the need protections for Maryland based RV dealers as well as protections for consumers. These were some of the concerns voiced by the Committee when a previous version of the bill was introduced during the 2024 session. With these improvements in mind this bill is important for the tourism industry in Worcester County. For these reasons, the Maryland Tourism Coalition asks this committee for a favorable report of this legislation and forward it for a full vote within the Senate of Maryland.

Dear Chair Smith, Vice Chair Waldstreicher and distinguished members of the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee:

I am here today, representing Maryland's Coast- Worcester County, to respectfully request your support for SB 079: Motor Home and Recreational Vehicle Shows in Worcester County – Permit for Out-of-State Dealers.

This local bill would establish a reciprocal out-of-state motor home and recreational trailer vehicle show permit, issued by the Motor Vehicle Administration. The permit would allow out-of-state dealers to display motor homes and recreational vehicles at shows in Worcester County, specifically at our Annual OC RV Show. However, no sales or deposits would be permitted at the show; customers would need to visit the dealer in their home state for any transactions.

Additionally, the bill stipulates that the permit will only be issued if the dealer's home state reciprocally allows Maryland dealers to exhibit vehicles at shows in that state.

Worcester County, home to about 54,000 residents, welcomes nearly 8 million visitors annually. Travel and tourism are vital to our economy, generating over \$2.6 billion in visitor spending last year alone.

Over the past four years, travelers' preferences have shifted towards outdoor recreation, adventure, and unique experiences. Worcester County is fortunate to offer many of these assets, which have contributed to our swift recovery from the pandemic's economic impacts. To sustain this growth, we must continue to attract visitors by offering experiences they seek.

RV and van life travel have gained significant popularity, with travelers making substantial investments in this lifestyle. Maryland offers a wide range of camping experiences, from mountains to beaches, and Worcester County alone has over 20 campgrounds within a 60-mile radius. Ocean City is planning its 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual RV Show in the expanded Convention Center; however, its full potential has been hindered by the current law restricting participation from out-of-state dealers.

Prohibiting these dealers from even displaying their vehicles drastically limits the variety, models and brand of product available to consumers. This bill would simply allow out-of-state dealers to display their vehicles, enhancing the diversity and appeal of the show. Increased participation would likely boost attendance, benefiting participating Maryland dealers through greater exposure and higher sales.

By offering a broader range of options to consumers—many of whom travel specifically for this event—this local bill has the potential to significantly boost visitation, increase overnight stays, and generate substantial tax revenue for the state through increased spending on accommodations, dining, retail, and amusements. This, in turn, strengthens Maryland's economy, supports local businesses, and creates new job opportunities.

Dear Chair Smith and Committee Members:

The Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) supports Senate Bill 79 as it will encourage tourism and economic growth in Maryland while ensuring reciprocity with neighboring states' laws.

SB 79 would establish reciprocal out-of-state motor home and recreational trailer permits available to applicants from states that establish reciprocity laws that would allow Maryland motor home and recreational trailer dealers to similarly exhibit at shows in those states. The show permit applications will be reviewed and approved by the Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) who will issue approved permits and retain a bond payment for the duration of a permit's term. The bond operates as a consumer protection measure for any possible investigation by the MVA into allegations of misconduct.

Currently, the MVA only has the authority to enforce Maryland laws around vehicle and trailer sales for businesses and salesmen licensed in Maryland. Any dealers and their salespeople who are not licensed in Maryland and conduct business at vehicle shows in the state would not be subject to consumer law enforcement for any sales initiated at those shows. SB 79 will resolve these concerns for consumer rights while creating opportunity for economic growth through increased tourism in Maryland.

The proposal would require an out-of-state dealer operating in a state where reciprocity laws allow Maryland dealers the ability to exhibit at industry shows to strictly exhibit under a show permit in Maryland. Permit holders would then initiate and complete a sale solely in the state in which the dealership is located, with the sale being subject to those jurisdiction's laws. This is already the case when Marylanders purchase vehicles in other states.

For these reasons, the Maryland Department of Transportation respectfully requests the Committee grant Senate Bill 79 a favorable report.

Many RV owners prefer to store their RVs near their favorite vacation destinations. Given Maryland's reputation as a sought-after vacation spot—with over 18 campgrounds within a 60-mile radius of Ocean City—our Maryland dealers stand to benefit by making more sales to visitors who enjoy vacationing in their RVs along our coast.

Currently, Worcester County lacks RV dealerships entirely, with the nearest Maryland dealer located 90 miles away. This amendment would address a critical market gap by allowing out-of-state dealers to showcase RVs without conducting on-site sales. All transactions would occur at their respective dealerships, ensuring full compliance with Maryland's tax, title, and registration requirements. Consequently, Maryland would not lose any state tax revenue.

Thank you, Chair Smith, Vice Chair Waldstreicher, and members of the distinguished Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee for allowing me to present Senate Bill 79 – Motor Home and Recreational Vehicle Shows in Worcester County – Permit for Out-of-State Dealers.

This local bill would allow out-of-state recreational vehicle dealers to display in vehicle shows for motor homes or recreational trailers in Worcester County. Out-of-state dealers would not be allowed to accept deposits or point of sales.

In addition, the local bill establishes an out-of-state motor home and recreational trailer vehicle show permit only if "that state reciprocally authorizes Maryland dealers of motor homes and recreational trailers to display or exhibit motor homes or recreational trailers at vehicle shows in that state."

These additional safeguards were added to this local bill to address the concerns raised by the Maryland Recreational Vehicle Dealer's Association and the issues that Governor Wes Moore raised in his May 23, 2024 Senate Bill 60 veto letter.

Last session this Committee and the full Senate unanimously passed Senate Bill 60 of 2024. However, this local legislation was amended substantially in the House of Delegates including revising it to a statewide bill, and SB 60 ultimately led to a veto by Governor Wes Moore.

Throughout the Interim, we have worked in good faith with the promoter of the OC RV & Van Lifestyle Show and Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration officials to address the concerns outlined in Governor Moore's veto letter.

SB 79 would expand consumer opportunities for Maryland constituents. As noted in testimony from the OC RV Show promoter, expanding the range of products to the OC RV Show provides consumers with access to a wide array of RVs and empowers them to make better-informed purchasing decisions.

This local bill also strengthens local tourism, thus benefitting the entire State of Maryland. The first two OC RV shows already are attracting attendees from over 15 states and the national appeal will continue to grow as more and more people are gravitating to the RV lifestyle.

By allowing more available, diverse options with out-of-state dealers being able to display their products at the OC RV Show while at the same time continuing to allow Maryland RV dealers to sell their products, the OC RV Show would increase attendance and sales for Maryland RV dealers, give consumers more options, and boost the local tourism economy.

I truly appreciate your kind attention and consideration, and I respectfully ask for a swift and favorable report on SB 79, a local Worcester County bill.

IT ALSO MAKES IT ALMOST IMPOSSIBLE FOR MOOT TO INFORCE CODES AGAINST DEALERS FROM OUT OF STATE.

THIS BILL DOES NOT BENEFIT THE STATE OR THE CONSUMERS OF MARYLAND. IT WILL NOT PROTECT THE INSTATE CONSUMER BY PURCHASING FROM AN OUT OF STATE DEALER. THE CONSUMER WOULD NOT HAVE THE PROTECTION OF THE MARYLAND CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT. IT APPEARS THIS BENEFITS A VERY FEW AND COMPROMISES A MAJORITY OF DEALERS IN MARYLAND.
