I, Sharon Y. Blake, am submitting testimony in support of Senate Bill 525, Illegal Dumping and Litter Control Law – Video Evidence and Reward Programs. I am a concerned resident of Baltimore County, District 10, personally aware of, and affected by, the problem Senate Bill 525 addresses. As many of you may be aware, District 10 includes the Liberty Road corridor, which is constantly littered with debris and that, with great regularity, due to the regular recurrence of the problem, Madame Speaker, Adrienne Jones, conducts cleanup campaigns along that corridor.
