Chair Smith, Vice-Chair Waldstreicher, and Members of the Committee, please be advised that the Baltimore City Mayor's Commission on Disabilities **supports House Bill 1363 – Places of Public Accommodation – Motion Pictures Houses – Captioning**.

The reason for this bill is simple – without it, no cinema in Baltimore City would have to offer any open-captioning screenings. Open-captioning means that Deaf and hard-of-hearing persons can read the dialogue on the big screen rather than use small captioning devices which, of course, interfere with the main reason why people still go the cinema. This bill makes Baltimore City theaters more accessible and inclusive.

Last session, we were delighted that the General Assembly enacted HB 426/SB 92, which requires certain motion picture houses to provide at least two open-caption movie screenings per week for the first three weeks of a movie premier. The motion picture house can select which two screenings to suit its business purposes. During the legislative process, the bill was amended so that it only applies to a motion picture house with at least eight screens. This means that only the very largest motion picture houses are subject to this requirement and in Baltimore City the most popular and well-attended locations are exempt. This bill would simply reduce from eight screens to four screens those motion picture houses affected.

We respectfully believe that this will better serve the Deaf and hard-of-hearing community, including many of our seniors, so that they too can fully enjoy the big screen experience. Over time, we anticipate that two open-captioning screenings per week will draw viewers who would otherwise stay home to watch a movie. It is our hope that this would both increase business and serve the cause of better accessibility.

This bill would alter the number of screens in a motion picture house above which the motion picture house is required to provide open movie captioning; requiring that each motion picture house that is a place of public accommodation report to the Commission on Civil Rights and the Attorney General on the number of screenings each month in which certain captions were used; and generally relating to movie captioning in motion picture houses.

At present, under the federal Americans with Disabilities Act ("ADA"), motion picture houses are required to provide closed captioning access for Deaf and hard-of-hearing persons, which

means small individual devices so that each person can read the dialogue as the movie plays on the big screen. But, as you can imagine, this is an awkward way to experience a film that was intended to be enjoyed on the big screen as one seamless experience.

The proposed requirement for open captioning for two screenings per week would mean that the dialogue would be displayed on the big screen. While there is some resistance to this for fear of an adverse financial impact, our investigation suggests that such screenings, particularly if offered at the more attractive times, would actually increase the overall audience because it would also be more accessible to seniors and persons for whom English is a second language. Having the dialogue on the big screen enhances the movie-going experience for a variety of individuals.

We therefore respectfully request a *favorable* report on House Bill 1363

POSITION: SUPPORT

Disability Rights Maryland (DRM – formerly Maryland Disability Law Center) is the designated Protection and Advocacy agency in Maryland, mandated to advance the civil rights of people with disabilities. DRM thanks the Committee for the opportunity to submit this testimony in support of House Bill 1363: Places of Public Accommodation - Captioning for Motion Picture Houses – Alterations.

HB 1363 seeks to lower the threshold for mandatory open captioning from theaters with eight or more screens to those with four or more screens. It requires these venues to provide open captioning for at least two screenings of each motion picture per week and to report the number of open and closed captioning screenings to the state. Last session, legislation was passed requiring that at least four showings of open-captioned films be provided weekly by certain movie theaters. State and local laws requiring that movie theaters provide open captioning are increasingly common throughout the nation. New York's City Council passed a bill, which went into effect in 2022, requiring some movie theaters to offer at least 25% of all showings to be open-captioned.¹ In comparison, Maryland has taken a more cautious approach, which may make compliance easier for movie theaters. Open captioning benefits many groups, including Deaf and hard-of-hearing individuals, older adults with hearing loss, and neurodivergent individuals.

Although Title III "Public Accommodations and Commercial Facilities" of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) was signed into law over 30 years ago, movie theater patrons with disabilities still have not achieved equal enjoyment of this public accommodation. The applicable law under 28 CFR § 36.202(b) states:

"A public accommodation shall not afford an individual or class of individuals, on the basis of a disability or disabilities of such individual or class, directly, or through contractual, licensing, or other arrangements, with the opportunity to participate in or benefit from a good, service, facility, privilege, advantage, or accommodation that is not equal to that afforded to other individuals."

Pursuant to a Final Rule issued in 2016 by the U.S. Department of Justice, movie theaters are required to provide captioning technology to patrons with disabilities.²

When this rule was issued, Deaf and hard-of-hearing individuals gained greater access to the public pastime of seeing movies in theaters. However, closed captioning is the most commonly provided option. Time has shown that closed captioning is insufficient as the sole auxiliary aid available to moviegoers with disabilities. Closed captioning devices provided to movie theater guests frequently malfunction, causing patrons to miss essential dialogue while seeking a repair or replacement. Oftentimes the technology fails to function properly at all.

Under ADA obligations, a movie theater may fulfill its obligation to provide captioning "through any technology so long as that technology provides communication as effective as that provided to movie patrons without disabilities."³ However, since closed captioning devices are often unreliable, theaters may instead choose to "use open movie captioning as an alternative to complying with the requirements."⁴

Maryland has joined other states implementing similar disability rights legislation to align with Title III of the ADA. Now that last year's legislation has been successfully implemented, it is time to expand that access to open captioning for the benefit of people with disabilities, older adults, children, English language learners, and others who rely on captions for an engaging moviegoing experience.

Dear Judicial Proceedings Committee:

I am writing on behalf of the Baltimore City Association of the Deaf (BCAD) to express our support for HB 1363 - Places of Public Accommodation – Captioning for Motion Picture Houses – Alterations, sponsored by Delegate Harry Bhandari. This bill mandates that motion picture houses with fewer than eight screens provide open captioning for at least two screenings each week.

The BCAD Board strongly believes that this bill will significantly benefit the diverse population of Baltimore City, including children and adults learning to read, senior citizens, veterans, individuals with learning or developmental disabilities, English language learners, and the Deaf, DeafBlind, and Hard of Hearing communities.

Not only will this bill benefit the residents of Baltimore City, but it will also provide greater accessibility to movie theaters across the state. This includes areas such as the Eastern Shore, Western Maryland, and other counties where movie theaters do not currently offer open captioned films. By lowering the threshold for open captioned screenings, this bill will make more theaters across Maryland accessible to a wider range of people, regardless of location.

Currently, there are no movie theaters in Baltimore City that are required to provide open captioned screenings, as the existing law mandates that theaters must have eight or more screens. This bill will lower the threshold to accommodate four theaters in the city that would be required to offer open captioned films:

- Senator Theatre 4 screens
- Charles Theatre 5 screens
- Harbor East Cinemas 7 screens
- Warehouse Cinemas Rotunda 7 screens

Many community members have expressed the difficulty of having to travel at least 30 minutes outside of Baltimore City to access open captioned movies. If this bill is passed, it would allow individuals to enjoy these screenings at theaters just a few minutes away, either by car or on foot.

Implementing this law will ensure open captioned movies are available to everyone in the community. We believe that the impact on movie theaters will be minimal. Offering two open captioned screenings per week will not significantly affect operations, as theaters will not need to hire additional staff to accommodate captioning. In fact, the change will likely attract more moviegoers, as individuals from the Deaf and Hard of Hearing community, as well as those who benefit from captioning, will have a convenient and accessible option to enjoy films.

This bill presents a win/win situation for both moviegoers and theaters alike. It ensures inclusivity and provides greater access to entertainment, benefiting people of all backgrounds.

Thank you for your time and attention to this important matter. We appreciate your support for HB 1363 and for making our community more accessible to everyone.

The **Maryland Continuing Care Residents Association (MaCCRA)** is a not-for-profit organization representing the residents in continuing care retirement communities (CCRCs). Maryland has more than 18,000 older adults living in CCRCs. The principal purpose of MaCCRA is to protect and enhance the rights and financial security of current and future residents while maintaining the viability of the providers, whose interests are frequently the same as their residents. MaCCRA SUPPORTS efforts to enhance transparency, accountability, financial security and preserve existing protections in law and regulation for current and future CCRC residents statewide, while maintaining and enhancing their quality of life.

Current law requires only theaters with <u>eight</u> or more screens to provide some showings with open captioning. **On behalf of Maryland Continuing Care Residents, we support House Bill 1363**, which extends the requirement for open captioning to apply to theaters with <u>four</u> or more screens.

A substantial proportion of the population we represent suffers from hearing deficits, yet wish to continue to enjoy a full life, including going to the movies. Without captioning and being unable to hear and understand dialogue, there is no point for them in buying a ticket to a movie. While the Americans with Disability Act (ADA) requires movie theaters to provide closed captioning, many theaters currently have equipment that does not work properly or does not work at all. More importantly, even when in good repair, using these devices is cumbersome, inconvenient, and often difficult. Looking back and forth between the device and the screen interferes with full comprehension and pleasurable viewing. Having open captions provides a very welcome alternative to using these devices and makes going to the movies once again possible and enjoyable.

Captions benefit many people, not only elders who struggle with hearing loss, but other deaf and hard of hearing viewers. In addition, those learning English, those who have auditory processing issues, those who struggle with accents, and people learning to read find captions helpful if not essential.

For these reasons we support House Bill 1363 and ask for a favorable report.

Thank you, Chair Smith, Vice Chair Waldstreicher, and the Committee, for the opportunity to explain why this bill is critically important for passage in the House. First, I want to express my gratitude for your past support and efforts in passing the previous version of the bill, which was signed by the Governor last year. And now, it's a pleasure to see you all again to discuss this important issue, which will ensure more movie theaters are more accessible across the State of Maryland.

Currently, the law mandates that movie theaters with 8 or more screens provide open-captioned movies twice a week for the first three weeks after a film's release. However, this applies to only 39 theaters statewide, leaving 15 theaters exempt from providing open-captioned movies. Our goal is to ensure that all movie theaters are accessible, so people don't have to drive up to an hour/50 miles just to see a movie with open captions.

Under the current law, these counties that only have theaters with 7 or fewer screens in most cases are not required to provide open-captioned movies in the following counties:

- Allegheny County
- Baltimore City
- Calvert County
- Dorchester County
- Kent County
- Talbot County
- Worcester County

This bill, which reduces the threshold to theaters with 4 or more screens, will help resolve this issue by ensuring that more movie theaters statewide—particularly in Eastern Shore, Southern Maryland, and Western Maryland—are able to provide more open captioned movies. For example, right now, only one movie theater is currently required to show open captions in the Eastern Shore area. With this bill, there will be up to five additional theaters, which is a 500% increase for accessibility for the Eastern Shore.

Open captioning means that everyone can enjoy the movie together, without needing separate devices for access. Right now, we must rely on bulky, uncomfortable glasses or a cupholder device that often malfunctions or dies. Precious time is taken away from movie enjoyment by going to the lobby to either replace or, if no replacement is available, get free ticket vouchers to come again another time. It's inconvenient and time consuming. Open captioned movies eliminate these problems, providing a more streamlined and enjoyable experience for all moviegoers.

I am hopeful that Maryland will lead the nation in ensuring equal access to movies for everyone. Passing this bill would make our state a shining example of inclusivity and accessibility.

Thank you again for your support over the years. Let's continue to work together to make Maryland a more welcoming and accessible state for all residents.

The Maryland Association of the Deaf (MDAD) is a statewide organization that protects the interests of Deaf, DeafBlind, and Hard of Hearing Marylanders concerning accessibility and equity issues. Currently, there are approximately 1.2 million of these individuals living in the State of Maryland.

MDAD is advocating for the passage of the HB 1363 sponsored by Delegate Bhandari regarding movie theater captioning. This bill requires that movie theaters with four or more screens provide open captioning for a minimum of two screenings each week. This effort would help further expand access to open captioned (OC) movies particularly in Western Maryland, North Central Maryland, Southern Maryland, and Eastern Shore areas. In addition, Deaf, DeafBlind, and Hard of Hearing customers and/or those with neurodivergent conditions from the surrounding states of Delaware, District of Columbia, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and West Virginia would more likely patronize the theaters in these areas. As a reminder, open captioned movies benefit not just the Deaf/DeafBlind/Hard of Hearing customers and those with neurodivergent conditions, but a larger segment of the movie-going public—including but not limited to—children, senior citizens, and those learning English as a second language. MDAD looks forward to a favorable report on HB 1363.

If more places offered open captions, I could go to more events- without having to go through the process of: 1- reaching out to request accommodations/captions, 2- following up and learning that my request was lost 3- checking in again, then providing captioning resources in hopes that they will be utilized, 4- going to the event and (many times, many times) finding out that they either a) weren't set-up/scheduled or b) aren't working. I can't count the number of times I have arrived early to an event only to be asked "You seem to talk and understand me ok; it will work without captions, right?" NO. I don't request captions to hear myself think or make more work for myself. I stopped going to movie theaters because they don't show enough time slots with open captions. We need more options of which movie to watch and more options of which day or night to go to the theater. The heavy dependence on closed captions and the limited open captions screenings made me give up going to movie theaters. I've tried the reflective gray glass viewer, which gave me a migraine every time I used it, plus it always shifted downward slowly so I had to hold the glass up with one hand for the entire duration of the movie. I've also tried the caption reader device (the kind that goes into the drink holder, same as the gray reflective glass), and I had to hold my drink in hand and also hold the device with my other hand from sinking down, while the hearing people in the audience were able to use their drink holders. I also tried the experience even more cumbersome. The electronic devices often ended up dead or ran out of battery power in the middle of the movie. Open Caption (OC) is the way to go that puts everyone on equal enjoyment: being able to sit back and relax, instead of making Deaf people have to work harder on "CC" access during the movie to be able to see the words clearly. We Deaf people need more options to enjoy what hearing people enjoy.

When movies become available with closed captions, it was an amazing awakening to watch films I had grown up with and know what was going on or to watch more recent movies available for home viewing. The provision of devices to watch closed captions in theaters may have been seen as progress, but I challenge a hearing person to use those devices without sound-many issues with actually being able to see clearly and in real time -especially if you wear corrective lenses. And the message is that there is something "wrong" with "subjecting" all viewers to captions, when in reality they are not disruptive when positioned properly. With open captions, we are all afforded equal access, and many people benefit including English language learners, and older people who are losing their hearing as well as people with disabilities that may affect auditory processing and other sensory experiences. Those not "needing" captions can still chose to attend those times when open captions are provided. The last open captioned movie I saw in theaters was "Barbie," in Silver Spring, MD a few years ago and my husband and I were probably the only deaf viewers, the others in the theater seemed to be hearing. Chair Smith, Vice Chair Waldstreicher, and Members of the Committee, please be advised that the Baltimore City Administration (BCA) respectfully requests a **favorable** committee report on House Bill (HB) 1363.

HB 1363 lowers the number of screens a cinema must have before it is required to provide open movie captioning from eight to four. Open-captioning means that Deaf and hard-of-hearing persons can read the dialogue on the big screen rather than use small captioning devices which interfere with the viewing experience. As it stands without the passage of this bill, no cinema within Baltimore City is required to offer open-captioning screenings. This bill amends that issue and makes Baltimore City theaters more accessible.

This will better serve the Deaf and hard-of-hearing community, including many Baltimore seniors, so that they too can fully enjoy the big screen experience. Over time, the BCA anticipates that two open-captioning screenings per week in Baltimore cinemas will draw viewers who would otherwise stay home to watch a movie, increasing both business and serve the cause of better accessibility.

Having the dialogue on the big screen enhances the movie-going experience for a variety of individuals.

While there may be some resistance to legislation this for fear of an adverse financial impact, such screenings, particularly if offered at the more attractive times, would actually increase the overall audience because it would also be more accessible to seniors and persons for whom English is a second language, boosting the overall customer base of cinemas.

Due to the above reasons, the Baltimore City Administration on Disabilities respectfully requests a **favorable** report on House Bill 1363.

The Maryland Developmental Disabilities Council (Council) is an independent public policy organization that creates change to make it possible for people with developmental disabilities to live the lives they want with the support they need. Our vision is that people with and without disabilities in Maryland live, learn, work, and play together. We support HB 1363 as another important step to ensure more Marylanders can live a life they want with meaningful access to movies in their communities.

Background

- The federal Americans with Disabilities Act requires places of public accommodation, like movie theaters, to be accessible to people with disabilities. Most movie theaters have closed movie captions systems for people who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing. Closed movie captions provide individual viewers access to captions on a device provided by a movie theater.
- Last year the General Assembly passed HB 426/SB92 which requires movie theaters with eight or more screens to provide open movie captions at least twice a week for each movie in the theater. This is required for the three weeks following a movie's release. Open movie captions provide all viewers access to captions on the movie screen.

WHAT does this legislation do?

- Changes the open movie captions requirement from movie theaters with eight screens to movie theaters with four screens.
- Also requires movie theaters to send a monthly report to the Commission on Civil Rights and Attorney General on the dates and number of times a movies had closed movie captions and open movie captions in the preceding month.

WHY is this legislation important?

- Video captions benefit everyone. Multiple studies have found that captioned videos increase comprehension, attention, and memory for everyone: children, youth, and adults. Research also finds benefits for people with disabilities, people for whom English is not their first language, and children and adults learning to read.
- A state-wide mandate supports making recreation accessible to everyone, regardless of where they live. The Americans with Disabilities Act and subsequent DOJ rulings have required access to captions in most workplaces and education settings without using an auxiliary device

(i.e., a handheld transmitter for captions like those required in close movie captions). This bill expands access to make recreation inclusive for all Marylanders regardless of where they live in the state and which movie theaters are in their communities.

• The current practice of relying on auxiliary devices for closed captions or to arrange for open captions ahead of time in movie theaters creates undue hardship on audience members. A reasonable accommodation is defined as making a place of public accommodation suitable for access, use, and patronage by an individual with a disability without danger to the **individual's health or safety and undue hardship or expense to the person making the** accommodation. Testimony on this bill for the last several years offers repeated examples of the burden on people seeking captions at movie theaters under current practices. This bill will increase accessibility and reduce the burden on patrons.

It is critical that people with disabilities have full access to every recreational option available, without barriers to access or inclusion, including movies. For these reasons, the Council supports HB 1363.

HB 1363 – Places of Accommodation – Captioning for Motion Picture Houses -<u>Alterations</u> Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee April 1, 2025 Opposed

On behalf of Mid-Atlantic NATO, a regional Association of Theatre Owners, representing movie theatres throughout Maryland, Virginia and DC, we respectfully submit these written comments in opposition to HB 1363.

Unnecessary and Burdensome Requirements

HB 1363 would add an unnecessary new requirement to Maryland's existing Captioning Law that would be impractical and add an undue burden to movie theatres. Specifically, all covered theatres would be required to report monthly on the number of closed movie captioned showtimes as well as the number of open captioned showtimes in the prior month, and they would be required to report all their showtimes for both open captioned and closed caption shows for the month.

- From a practical standpoint, this would not coincide with the weekly requirements of the law nor fit a theatre operation. Theatres operate on a weekly basis, not monthly, and the law has weekly requirements as well.
- With rare exception, all non-open captioned showtimes have closed captioning available as required by federal guidelines, so there would be no benefit to gather this information. As for the open captioned showtimes, they are available for public review on theatre websites daily.
- Looking back at a previous month would be time-consuming and impractical, as the weekly requirements of the law would overlap into different months. Collecting and reporting all this information would add labor costs to the theatres that can ill afford additional costs as they struggle to stay financially viable.
- From a volume standpoint, the state would be collecting 12 months of reports from the 53 locations covered in the bill. That would equate to almost 650 reports, and there would be upwards of over 850,000 showtimes reported over a year. (551 screens in the state x average of 30 shows per week x 52 weeks = 859,956 showtimes per year.) Having the Commission on Civil Rights and the Attorney General office collect and review these numerous reports would be extremely time consuming and add labor costs to the state and the movie theatres.
- Requiring showtime reporting is both costly and unnecessary for compliance purposes. Under existing Maryland law, a single failure to comply is sufficient for enforcement purposes.



Expansion of Open Captioning in Maryland

Currently there are 39 locations with 8 screens or more covered by Maryland's existing Captioning Law, for a total of 473 screens. HB 1363 would lower the 8 screens threshold to 4, adding an additional 14 locations in the state, with 78 more screens, bringing the total to 53 locations, 551 screens. Maryland has only two locations with less than 4 screens. Both are non-profit and already play open captioned shows voluntarily.

With the passage of HB 1363, we estimate that Maryland's movie theatres would play almost 50,000 Open Caption Showings annually, well in excess of consumer demand.

Collaboration and Commitment

Maryland's movie theaters are committed to access for individuals that are deaf or hard of hearing. For over 25 years, the movie theater industry has collaborated with individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing, advocacy groups, film studios, and technology developers to achieve access to all feature films at all times.

Moviegoers in Maryland seeking captions have the flexibility to view a movie with captions at any showtime, on any day. In 2016, the Department of Justice issued a final rule requiring digital movie theaters to provide closed movie captioning equipment. The DOJ adopted the majority of recommendations set forth in an agreement between the National Association of Theatre Owners and major advocacy groups, including the Hearing Loss Association of America and the National Association of the Deaf. Through these collaborative efforts, today, digital movie theaters in Maryland offer closed movie captioning devices (allowing text to be viewable by an individual moviegoer) that can be used at any show time for any movie that comes with closed movie captions.

Mid-Atlantic NATO had worked with the sponsor of HB 1363 prior to a House Hearing held on March 4, 2025, and together with deaf or hard of hearing advocates, had mutually agreed to remove the section on the reporting requirements. For whatever reason, the prepared amendment never made its way to the committee and was not considered when they gave a favorable report.

State of the Industry

Movie theaters in the state of Maryland continue to face economic challenges due to the lasting impacts of the pandemic and the Hollywood strikes. While the industry is slowly on a path to recovery, theaters are continually working to stabilize their businesses, and any additional regulations at this stage would place further strain on operators as they move forward.



The Status of Maryland Movie Theatres

Despite slight gains in attendance numbers from when theatres were shuttered due to the pandemic, 2024 box office admissions in Maryland remained at least 27.4% lower for the year than they were pre-pandemic, and even lower than they were the in 2023. It will likely take years for Maryland theatres to recover their pandemic related losses and the Hollywood labor strikes only further compounded the issue by limiting new product in 2024.

In the last twenty-four months two large theatre operators closed six significant Maryland locations and since the pandemic numerous other smaller operators left Maryland including ArcLight Cinemas, Bow Tie Cinemas, CMX/CinéBistro, New Vision Theatres, and Northeast/Hoyts Cinema.

Most recently, the AMC Lexington Park closed on March 5, 2025, while the Regal Theatre in Germantown and the Next Act Theatre in Pikesville closed permanently in December of 2024. The start of 2025 has already been the worst for Maryland's movie theatres in recent years, and theatre film supply continues to be affected by direct to streaming and Hollywood's recent labor strikes. Adding showtime and reporting requirements will directly and negatively impact the continuing financial viability of the remaining Maryland theaters.

A full listing of Maryland Movie Theatres covered by the current law, those that would be added by HB 1363, and those that recently closed in the state follows these comments.

The Office of Attorney General (OAG) respectfully offers this letter of information to the Judicial Proceedings Committee on **House Bill 1363** - Places of Public Accommodation – Captioning for Motion Picture Houses – Alterations. **House Bill 1363** extends statutory provisions that govern movie captioning requirements to apply to a motion picture house with at least four screens and requires motion picture houses that are places of public accommodation to report to the Maryland Commission on Civil Rights and the Attorney General on certain metrics.

The OAG has concerns with the reporting requirement established in **House Bill 1363**. More specifically, the bill requires certain motion picture houses to report certain metrics to the MCCR and the Attorney General monthly. The OAG does not have a database to receive these reports, nor is there clear language in the bill that explains what OAG is supposed to do with the information in the reports once the reports are received.

The OAG has spoken with a member of the Sponsor's staff who stated that there are amendments being submitted to the Committee that would remove this reporting requirement from the bill. If these amendments are accepted by the Committee, the OAG would no longer have concerns.

The OAG urges the Committee to consider this issue carefully as it deliberates on the passage of **House Bill 1363**.
