By encouraging good faith efforts to save lives without the fear of prosecution, the bill supports a compassionate and life-saving approach that can help break the cycle of addiction and loss.

While we recognize that the bill could result in increased state spending, primarily due to longer incarceration times, we believe the long-term benefits—reducing opioid-related harm and saving lives—are worth the investment. This bill is a critical part of the broader effort to tackle Maryland's opioid crisis.

We respectfully request that you give House Bill 1398 your full support and pass it through the committee with a FAVORABLE report. Thank you for your continued leadership and commitment to our communities' safety and well-being.
