RE: H.B. 289 – INCARCERATED INDIVIDUAL
APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM
POSITION: SUPPORT

The Associated Builders and Contractors of Maryland support HB 289, which requires the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to establish an apprenticeship program in skilled trades for incarcerated individuals.

This legislation offers a crucial opportunity to returning citizens and will increase the pool of skilled trade workers in Maryland. By providing incarcerated individuals with valuable job skills, HB 289 directly addresses the root causes of recidivism.

When individuals are equipped with marketable skills, they are more likely to find employment upon release, increasing their economic stability and reducing their likelihood of returning to the criminal justice system.
