Re: House Bill 533: Peace Orders and Protective Orders-Military Protection Orders

Dear Chairman Clippinger and Members of the Committee

For victims of abuse, harassment and threats who were issued a Military Protective Order ("MPO"), HB533 will assist in providing continuity in protection while both on and off military installations by doing two things:

- Maryland judges will be able to consider already existing MPOs when adjudicating cases for temporary relief for victims who have been issued an MPO.
- Civilian law enforcement may report to military law enforcement if there is probable cause to believe that an MPO has been violated.

Military Protective Orders are not enforced or recognized off military installations; therefore, military law enforcement has no enforcement authority over service members' behavior while off military installations and who are under MPOs. However, by allowing for evidence to be introduced that indicates an existing MPO and enhanced communication between military and civilian law enforcement, victims will be given additional continuous protection while both on and off military installations.

I respectfully request your favorable report on HB533.
