The Maryland Network Against Domestic Violence (MNADV) is the state domestic violence coalition that brings together victim service providers, allied professionals, and concerned individuals for the common purpose of reducing intimate partner and family violence and its harmful effects on our citizens. MNADV urges the House Judiciary Committee to issue a favorable report on HB 706.

Maryland requires the consent of every party to a phone call or conversation to make an audio recording lawful. Currently, a violation of the wiretap law is a felony and subject to punishment including imprisonment for not more than 5 years or a fine of not more than \$10,000, or both.

HB 706 would reclassify a violation of the wiretap law from a felony to a misdemeanor. MNADV supports a victim's ability to use a recording of the violence they suffered in court proceedings (See HB 314). Currently it is a felony for a victim, including victims of domestic violence and sexual assault, to record and document the abuse and violence they experienced and use it to obtain relief from the courts. HB 706 is an important attempt to remediate Maryland's wiretap laws.

For the above stated reasons, the Maryland Network Against Domestic Violence urges a favorable report on HB 706.
