I have volunteered with Out For Justice, an organization that

is led by individuals impacted by the legal system, for many years. Many of the wonderful, amazing members struggle to support themselves and their families, including children who do not live with them full time and others who do. Blended families are particularly common in communities where fathers and mothers have been removed from their children's lives due to incarceration and struggling with other life issues. It only prevents justice-impacted individuals from getting to the next step in life when they have to choose between which children they can support, especially when they are getting back on their feet and struggling to make ends meet. Courts should take situations like this into consideration.

HB0275 would mandate that the court considering a child support award consider any children in the household of the payor, and grant an allowance for such children in their calculations. This will not only lead to more equitable results, it will increase the likelihood of consistent and full child support payments.
