**POSITION:** Oppose only as to the provision on page 2, lines 29 through 31

The Maryland Judiciary has no position on the policy aims of this legislation and only opposes the provision on page 2, lines 29 through 31, which requires that a sentence imposed shall be consecutive. The Judiciary traditionally opposes legislation that includes mandatory provisions as they intrude on judicial discretion. The Judiciary believes it is important for judges to weigh the unique facts and circumstances for each individual case when imposing a sentence. Mandatory provisions prevent the judge from considering those unique factors. Recognizing that lawmakers are responsible for enacting penalties for crimes, judges are mindful of various mitigating factors in crafting a sentence that most appropriately fits the individual defendant and the crime.
