Many young people fear expressing their opinions or participating in civic engagement because they know their personal information could be exposed and used against them.

No one should have to live in fear because their private information has been weaponized against them. Doxxing is not just an invasion of privacy—it is a form of intimidation that silences voices and puts lives at risk.

I urge you to support this bill to help protect people from being targeted, threatened, and silenced simply for existing or expressing their beliefs. HB1150 is a crucial step in ensuring that individuals have legal recourse against this form of digital harassment and that those who engage in doxxing are held accountable.
