

LEGISLATIVE BLACK CAUCUS OF MARYLAND, INC. The Manufand House of Delegates: 4 Bladen Street Poom 300, Apagooks, Manufand 21401

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Dear Chair and Members of the Committee,

The Legislative Black Caucus of Maryland offers its strong and favorable support for House Bill 311 (HB311) / Senate Bill 648 (SB648) – Medical Parole Reform. This legislation removes the requirement for gubernatorial approval in granting medical parole to individuals serving life sentences, ensuring that the Maryland Parole Commission can make timely decisions based on medical necessity rather than political influence. HB311/SB648 is a critical step toward a more just and compassionate criminal justice system, allowing incarcerated individuals who are terminally ill or severely debilitated to receive medical care in a more humane setting.

The impact of this legislation is particularly significant for Black Marylanders, who are disproportionately incarcerated and more likely to suffer from chronic health conditions such as heart disease, diabetes, and hypertension. Incarceration often worsens these conditions due to inadequate healthcare and the stress of long-term confinement. Without accessible medical parole, many Black individuals serving life sentences are left to suffer in prison with little recourse, even when they no longer pose any risk to public safety. HB311/SB648 ensures that those facing severe, life-threatening illnesses are given the opportunity to receive proper medical treatment in appropriate healthcare facilities or with family support, restoring dignity to those who might otherwise endure unnecessary suffering.

By removing gubernatorial approval from the medical parole process, HB311/SB648 eliminates an unnecessary bureaucratic barrier that has disproportionately impacted Black individuals seeking compassionate release. This reform upholds the principles of fairness and justice while also alleviating financial strain on the state by reducing the costs associated with incarcerating individuals with serious medical conditions. Furthermore, it allows families to provide care and support to their loved ones in their final days, strengthening Black communities that have been disproportionately affected by mass incarceration.

For these reasons, the Legislative Black Caucus of Maryland strongly supports HB311/SB648.
