Dear Ways and Means Committee:

We currently have obscenity laws that prohibit obscene content provided to minor children and defined as illegal under Maryland State Criminal Law Code Annotated §11-201, § 11-202, § 11-203 and federal 18 U.S.C. § 1470.

Currently, school libraries and media centers are ignoring these laws using obscene/sexually explicit content (both graphic and textual) designed and selected to sexualize children. There needs to be protective measures in place to protect minors. Sexual exploitation of children is a major problem in Maryland. If any adult were to show another adult the content of these books in the workplace, it would be classified as sexual harassment.
