Consumers benefit from legalized iGaming:

- A legal and regulated option versus playing on illegal sites
- Responsible gaming tools and support
- Excludes underage players
- Protects adult consumers

Why increased taxes on sports betting won't work:

- Risks shifting consumers back to illegal (unregulated and untaxed) sites
- Disproportionately hurts smaller operators making Maryland less competitive
- Undermines the goals of consumer protection and tax revenue generation
- Stunts a new and flourishing industry for Maryland!
- Falls far short of raising the tax revenue that legal iGaming would generate

Reject the sports betting tax hike and bring legal iGaming to Maryland!
