*RE: HB 1103 (Atterbeary) - Local Government - Accommodations Intermediaries - Hotel Rental Tax Collection by Comptroller - Favorable* 

Dear Chair Atterbeary and Members of the Committee,

On behalf of TechNet, I'm writing to share comments on HB 1103 related to hotel rental tax collections.
