House Bill 215 - Ways and Means - FAVORABLE

Chair, Vice Chair, and Members of the Ways and Means Committee;

Please give House Bill 215, regarding ranked choice voting, a FAVORABLE report.

Ranked choice voting is the most intelligent way to choose a candidate. The people have more of a say under ranked choice voting. For example, in 2020 I could've given Elizabeth Warren and Bernie Sanders my first and second slots. Then I could rank the others, which would've put Biden and Bloomberg at the bottom of my list. While I don't believe that Sanders or Warren would win a primary in moderate Maryland, perhaps one of my middle choices would've won, like O'Rourke or Buttigieg. Let's be a part of that, and actually put forth a candidate who people WANT to vote for.
