We strongly support this bill as a critical step toward strengthening Maryland's democracy through improved election fairness and modernized election technology.

This legislation authorizes **ranked-choice voting (RCV)** for presidential primaries starting in 2028 and establishes requirements for the certification and periodic evaluation of election-supporting technology.

Why We Support This Bill:

- 1. **Fairer Elections:** RCV ensures candidates are elected with majority support, reducing vote-splitting and better reflecting voter preferences.
