Hello, my name is Cadence Natividad, and I am a Garrett County Student Member on the Board of Education. I am here today to represent the youth of Garrett County.

I am connected to HB0052, which would authorize the General Assembly to allow counties to lower the voting age for members of an elected county board of education to 16 years old. This bill directly impacts my peers and me, as it gives us a voice in the decisions that shape our schools and communities.

Across the state, decisions made by the Board of Education affect our daily lives—our classrooms, extracurricular opportunities, and access to mental health resources. Yet, the very people most affected by these decisions often have no voice in electing those who make them. This bill seeks to change that by empowering students aged 16 and older to have a say in the future of our education.
