TESTIMONY ON HB#1014 Fair Share Act for Maryland: FAVORABLE

OPENING: My name is Emily Blank, a resident of District 47a. I am submitting this testimony in support of HB#1014, (Fair Share for Maryland Act).

I am a retired Economics professor (38 years at Howard University). I am also a member of Congregation Oseh Shalom in Laurel MD and Bend the Arc, Jewish Action,

I am quite concerned about the budget shortfall that MD currently suffers and the possibility of resulting cuts in investment in human beings (e.g., in education and social services). The Fair Share Act would close tax loopholes that benefit the wealthy and rob our state of revenue.
