

Testimony on behalf of the Greater Bethesda Chamber of Commerce

In Support of
House Bill 1280—Election Law—Affiliating With a Party and Voting—Unaffiliated Voters

February 26, 2025 House Ways and Means Committee

The Greater Bethesda Chamber of Commerce (GBCC) was founded in 1926. Since then, the organization has grown to more than 600 businesses located throughout the Greater Bethesda area and beyond. On behalf of these members, we appreciate the opportunity to provide written comments on House Bill 1280—Election Law—Affiliating With a Party and Voting—Unaffiliated Voters.

House Bill 1280 allows unaffiliated voters the ability to affiliate with a political party at an early voting center during a primary election for the purpose of voting. According to the Montgomery County Board of Elections, one quarter of Montgomery County residents are unaffiliated, all of whom choose not to affiliate for different reasons. This is common among some immigrant communities, where some reports suggest that as much as fifty percent of foreign-born voters do not identify with either political party. Others may simply choose to be unaffiliated to avoid the constraints of a political party. This bill would allow those unaffiliated Marylanders the ability to vote and have their voice heard in the primary election, thereby increasing overall voter turnout and encouraging broader civic engagement.

For these reasons, we would respectfully request a favorable vote on House Bill 1280. Thank you for the opportunity to provide written comments.
