Education - Maryland Civic Excellence Program - Established Maryland Association of Student Councils Mara Babb - State Legislative Affairs Coordinator

Good Afternoon Chair Atterbeary, Vice Chair Wilkins, and members of the Ways and Means Committee,

My name is Mara Babb and I am a student from Anne Arundel County. I also serve as a State Legislative Affairs Coordinator for the Maryland Association of Student Councils (MASC). On behalf of MASC, I request a favorable report on HB72.

The Maryland Association of Student Councils (MASC) is a youth-led organization composed of secondary school student councils all across the state advocating for the best interest of Maryland students. We have passed a resolution in favor of this bill, voted on by a delegation of MASC's elected and appointed officials, regional student government presidents, and student members of boards of education across the state. Additionally, MASC has exhibited unanimous support of the Maryland Civic Excellence Program during the 2024 Legislative Session and MASC's statewide Convention Conference.

MASC calls on the General Assembly to support the education and promotion of civic engagement and civic literacy by passing HB72.
