My name is Joseph Fisher. I am the Founder and CEO of First Generation College Bound. I also serve as the Chair of the Maryland Alliance for College Affordability and Equity. Maryland Alliance is a group of non-profit organizations throughout Maryland that assist and support students students from low-income - first generation families pursuing a higher education.

I am pleased to testify on behalf of the Maryland Alliance to support <u>HB688 High</u> <u>School Graduation Requirements-Financial Aid Application.</u>

This legislation promotes and supports FAFSA/MSFAA Completing which we greatly recognized the need. Maryland Alliance has more than 35 years years practicing FAFSA Completion. It has contributed greatly to our success promoting college affordability to our students and their parents. Completing the FAFSA, with our encouragement and support especially to our low income students has enabled them to attend college and graduate with little to no debt. This is due to the FAFSA being completed on time and the results making them eligible for Federal, State, and College Financial Aid they were not aware.

In closing, Maryland Alliance supports HB688 for FAFSA/MSFAA completion as it will contribute greatly to more students attending an affordable college and graduating. However, Maryland Alliance will be concerned about required regulations if any. This is due to our knowledge, and years of experience with FAFSA completion and knowing the challenges of our schools, especially counselors. As a result Maryland Alliance is requesting an opportunity to provide input for regulation input.
