Dear Chairman Guzzone,

I am writing in strong support of House Bill 266 - Department of Information Technology - Information Technology Investment Fund -Uses, the Department of Information Technology's departmental bill before the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee.

HB 266 is a targeted, commonsense update to current law that reflects how the State's technology and communications infrastructure has evolved. While existing statutes appropriately supported legacy systems such as the State communications network and the Maryland FiRST radio system, today's environment requires greater flexibility to manage and reinvest in modern, statewide infrastructure that supports cloud connectivity, data centers, and shared enterprise services.

This legislation allows existing revenues generated through Resource Sharing Agreements to be reinvested more effectively into state-owned communication sites, facilities, and telecommunications equipment tied to information technology agreements. Importantly, HB 266 does not create new fees, impose new costs on agencies or local governments, or require additional appropriations. Instead, it enables the Department of Information Technology to make better use of revenues from existing resources to maintain assets, plan for lifecycle upgrades, and strengthen the reliability and resilience of Maryland's statewide IT and public safety communications infrastructure.
