

I oppose this bill because this bill goes against the First Amendment. The First Amendment reflects the foundational principles upon which the United States was established. It protects our freedom to express our beliefs, to think independently without government coercion, and to associate freely with others. These liberties are central to a free society.

We are currently witnessing these events unfold in South Korea. The country is becoming like communist North Korea, where citizens are stripped of their freedom to express their opinions. We believe that America must avoid following such a path.

This bill would infringe upon our constitutionally protected religious and political expression.

Therefore, I strongly oppose this bill.
