RE: **SB0903** – Education - Engagement Policies and School Compact (Maryland Public Education Parental Partnership Act) -- **FAVORABLE**

The Maryland Federation of Republican Women strongly supports SB0903 to ensure that parents are advised about and involved in their children's education. Having parents participate in the development of policies governing the education of their children will promote better understanding and cooperation among teachers, administrators, and parents. That cooperation will lead to better student outcomes.

SB0903 will aid parents in carrying out their ultimate duty -- the care and direction of their children.

Parents need to be informed when there are concerns about or changes in the behavior of their children. Requiring parental notice when a student is disruptive, has been attacked, requests to use a different gender, name or pronoun, or seeks mental health counseling is essential to the well-being of the child.

Parents are the ones who must deal with the consequences of school policies long after school hours have ended. They need to have information on all extracurricular activities and clubs their child enrolls in and be able to approve or deny the student's participation in that activity. Parental rights must be respected.

SB0903 removes ambiguity about the rights of parents and supports parents' engagement in their child's education.
