RE: HB668 – St. Mary's County – Prohibition on Standing in Inherently Dangerous Highway

Dear Chair Korman, Vice-Chair Guyton and Committee Members:

The St. Mary's County Delegation supports HB668 – St. Mary's County – Prohibition on Standing in Inherently Dangerous Highway unanimously with a vote of three (3) Yeas and no (0) Neas.

The purpose of the bill is to prohibit a person in St. Mary's County from standing in a roadway, a shoulder, a median divide, or an intersection determined by the county or a municipal corporation in the county to be inherently dangerous. There are certain intersections in the county which have had a high number of accidents, a high volume of traffic, and/or a narrow median or shoulder structure making the intersection dangerous for individuals to stand in the roadway. St. Mary's County proposes to prohibit standing at these locations and placing signage indicating the inherently dangerous highway for the safety of pedestrians.

We ask for the committee's consideration of this bill and a FAVORABLE report.
