Honorable Members of the Environment and Transportation Committee,

I am writing today in support of HB1411 Data Center Planning and Transparency Act. As rising electricity rates, destructive and costly transmission projects, and noise pollution continue to impact the everyday life of Maryland Citizens, people have dramatically turned against data centers. The unfettered building of these data centers without thorough public scrutiny has already caused irreversible harm to the people of Maryland. Now that people are aware of the astronomic societal costs associated with data centers, and the nebulous “benefit” they supposedly bring, there will be significant public backlash to any announced data center development. The State must act wholistically to rein the impacts of data centers because the effects are not just felt within eyeshot of proposed data centers. Projects like the Maryland Piedmont Reliability Project aim to clearcut a line of destruction through three Maryland counties to power data centers that are not even in our state.
