House Bill 74- State Procurement-Construction and Services- Contract Modification

Dear Chair Wells and Members of the Committee,

Thank you for this opportunity to submit this letter of support for House Bill 74. House Bill 74 would require state construction and service contracts to include an equitable adjustment clause, allowing for cost adjustments when either:


- (1) Increased costs for compensation mandated by statute, or
- (2) Increased costs related to enforcement of collective bargaining agreements.

The bill is carefully crafted to apply only when a contract exceeds \$2 million with a term of 3 years or longer. The contract modification would be contingent upon the approval of the Chief Procurement Officer.

The bill protects businesses with large procurement contracts of a duration of three or more years from unforeseen changes in law and enforcement of collective bargaining rights long after the procurement is bid upon.

House Bill 74 is a crucial piece of legislation that will provide much needed relief to contractors and subcontractors who are impacted by legislative or regulatory changes that mandate certain cost increases. By allowing for contract modifications to account for increased costs resulting from statutory changes increasing required compensation or benefits, or from the result of changes from collective bargaining, contractors will be able to offset the financial burdens imposed by these changes.

The bill strikes fairness between the State and the business community. For the above reasons, we respectfully request a favorable report.
