The Maryland State Education Association strongly supports Senate Bill 255. This legislation would prohibit local county and municipal corporations from adopting election methods that impair or restrict a protected class's ability to participate in the political process and elect preferred candidates.

MSEA represents more than 44 local affiliates in every county across the state of Maryland, and our parent affiliate is the 3-million-member National Education Association (NEA).

Underrepresentation at the federal, state, and local levels has a profound impact on communities, affecting access to local infrastructure, health care, environmental protections, investments in public schools and universities, and so much more. Strengthening and ensuring every citizen's access to the ballot box strengthens our democracy and ensures an equal voice in shaping our nation's future.
