Perinatal mental health conditions affect thousands of Maryland families each year and are often preventable and treatable when identified early. Addressing these conditions is not only a matter of compassionate care, but also a public health imperative. Hospitals support efforts to strengthen the continuum of perinatal mental health care that protects both maternal and infant health.

Hospitals share the goal of ensuring patients are connected to appropriate services early in pregnancy and throughout the postpartum period.
