

As a member of the Route 210 Traffic Safety Committee and a resident of Fort Washington, Maryland, I support Senate Bill 152 Point to Point Speed Monitoring Systems-Maryland Route 210.

As a member of the Route 210 Traffic Safety Committee, I attend monthly meetings. A member of the local police department reports that drivers speed more than 100 miles per hour every month on Route 210.

Under Senate Bill 152 Point to Point Speed Monitoring Systems-Maryland Route 210, sensors will be installed that will calculate the average speed of the motor vehicle between two geographically fixed points. These sensors are needed because drivers on Route 210 slow down prior to the speed camera so a slower speed is recorded.

I travel Route 210 to go from Fort Washington to Waldorf. Upon returning from a recent trip I saw a car smashed up going south near Swann Creek Road. One of these vehicles involved in the accident must have been speeding at a high rate of speed.

Something needs to be done to hold speeders accountable on Route 210.
