Subject: **Request for FAVORABLE Report** – HB0844 – Motor Vehicle Registration - Fee Exemption - Unemployable Disabled Veterans

Dear Chair Smith and distinguished members of the Judicial Proceedings Committee
On behalf of the members of the Maryland Military Coalition¹ (MMC) I write to recommend a **FAVORABLE report** by the Committee on **HB0844 – Motor Vehicle Registration - Fee Exemption - Unemployable Disabled Veterans**, sponsored by Delegate Mike Griffith. **The House unanimously passed this bill.**

Delegate Mike Griffith's bill aims to expand benefits to veterans with a service-connected unemployability rating (typically 50-99% but compensated at 100%). This legislation addresses a gap for veterans who are rated as unemployable but may not have a 100% combined disability rating, extending them the same fee-exempt benefits as fully disabled veterans. Two other related bills, HB0716 (introduced in the 2024 regular session) and HB0248 (introduced in the 2025 regular session) also requested vehicle registration fee exemptions for one vehicle, but neither bill passed. The House unanimously passed this bill.

Maryland State Statutes – Transportation – Section §13–619.4 (c) and §13–619.4 (d) (1) and (2)² states:

- The Administration may issue a special disabled veteran registration plate that does not display the international symbol of access in recognition of the vehicle owner's service-connected disability to an individual who is a veteran and is between 50% and 99%, inclusive, service-connected disabled.
- The Administration:
 - Shall charge the annual registration fee and surcharge otherwise required under this title for special disabled veteran registration plates issued under this section.
 - May not charge or retain any additional fee for the special registration plates.

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While currently, a service-connected disabled veteran with a rating of 50-99% and unemployable, receives a free license plate and/or placard, the current fee for a 3-year registration (based upon vehicles weight) is between \$361.50 and \$574.50. This is significant savings for Total Disability Individual Unemployability (TDIU) veterans who are facing financial challenges.

Conducting Google searches, all 50 states provide some form of registration fee exemptions for 100% disable veterans, and very few offer this fee exemption for more than one vehicle. Of the 50 states, only seven do not reference TDIU veterans, just those veterans that are totally (100%) disabled – this includes Maryland. The seven states that do not reference TDIU veterans are Arkansas, Hawaii, Maryland, New Hampshire, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia. No state is exempt from fiscal challenges; however, 43 states have taken positive actions to ensure TDIU veterans are not left behind, regardless of their fiscal challenges.

Maryland **must be** the 44th state that shows our TDIU veterans that they are not forgotten. This is why the Maryland Military Coalition **strongly supports** HB0844 and asks for a **FAVORABLE** report from the Judicial Proceedings Committee.
