

Testimony on HB0630: Correctional Services - Immigration Detention Facilities - Original Design and Construction

Dear Honorable Chair Bartlett, Vice Chair Davis, and Members of the Committee,

My name is Marian Marbury and I am a resident of Baltimore, MD. I strongly urge the committee to pass HB0630.

I support HB0630 because current Maryland law creates loopholes that allow private companies to obtain approvals on detention centers without the proper zoning requirements. Buildings utilized to house goods are being bought to detain human beings with no regard for whether they have the correct infrastructure to safely and humanely do so. Given the [human rights abuses we are seeing at the Fallon Center](#) in Baltimore, where a hundred or more immigrants are crammed into tight spaces with no access to clean water or facilities, there is a clear need to develop laws that will enforce basic health and safety standards on building operations.

Please consider what we have found out about the warehouse that ICE bought in Williamsport, MD. It has four toilets and two water fountains, and is allotted 800 gallons of water a day. Housing 1500 detainees will require a minimum of over 200,000 gallons a day and the current infrastructure is completely inadequate. Even if that much water can be found, the pipes aren't large enough to permit that increased waterflow. We already have seen that the ICE modus operandi is to act first and plan later. Therefore the likelihood that basic health and safety will receive adequate attention unless forced to by this legislation is extremely low.

For health and safety reasons, as a general rule facilities originally built to be utilized to house goods or services should not be able to be repurposed into detention facilities. This law aims to prohibit individuals from operating sites as detention facilities when the original purpose of the site was not intended to be a detention facility.

Maryland has an obligation to implement laws that protect the health and safety of all human beings, especially those who are detained or incarcerated. For the reasons stated in this testimony, I respectfully urge a favorable report on HB0630.
