The Maryland Academy of Physician Assistants (MdAPA) supports *House Bill 1146 – Crime of Violence - Medical Facilities and Places of Worship - Penalty (Sacred Places Safety Act)*. According to the World Health Organization, up to 38% of healthcare workers experience physical violence in the workplace.¹ Maryland has already enacted legislation to establish a felony penalty for violence against first responders who provide medical care. Healthcare professionals who are also on the frontline of providing healthcare in hospitals and other settings should have equal protection.
