RE: Senate Bill 1, *Public Safety – Law Enforcement Officers – Prohibition on Face Coverings*

Support

I am writing to express my support for Senate Bill 1, *Public Safety – Law Enforcement Officers – Prohibition on Face Coverings*. The bill requires the Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission to develop a uniform policy prohibiting the use of face coverings by a law enforcement officer that conceals or obscures the officer's facial identity in the course of duty. Exceptions to the mask prohibition include allowances for tactical operations for purposes of physical safety, and medical masks applicable for occupational health and safety. A county, municipality, or a law enforcement agency of the State or a political subdivision of the State, may not adopt an anti-masking policy other than the policy developed by the Commission. A law enforcement officer who violates the mask ban would be guilty of a civil offense, and on conviction, would be subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,500. A police officer may issue a citation to a law enforcement officer who is committing or has committed the face covering violation.

As the Trump Administration pursues aggressive immigration enforcement, raids by mask-wearing agents of the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement have terrorized our communities and have had a chilling effect on local law enforcement. Residents who may have been generally supportive of the police, and who previously trusted law enforcement to provide community safety and promote stability, have either lost that relationship with police officers or have become extremely suspicious of any law enforcement in their midst.

I am certain that numerous legal and operational concerns will be raised as the Committee deliberates the provisions of Senate Bill 1 and will need to be addressed. I stand ready to support the Committee in any way as it works to address these issues.
