AN ACT to require certain buildings and occupancies to have diaper-changing amenities accessible to certain occupants under certain conditions; and generally relating to the Howard County Building Code.

20	B, EDUCATIONAL GROUP E, INSTITUTIONAL GROUP I-1, I-2, AND I-4,
21	Mercantile Group M, Residential Group R-1, and Storage Group

23	(2) IN EACH PORTION OF THE OCCUPANCY THAT CONTAINS A PUBLIC
24	TOILET OR BATHROOM, PERSONS OF ALL GENDERS MUST HAVE ACCESS TO A
25	DIAPER-CHANGING STATION OR SIMILAR AMENITY THAT IS SAFE, SANITARY,
26	AND CONVENIENT.

28	(I) BUILDINGS THAT ALREADY HAVE A NEW BUILDING PERMIT
29	AND ARE NOT UNDERGOING RENOVATIONS;

31	RENOVATIONS DO NOT REQUIRE A BUILDING PERMIT;
32	(III) BUILDINGS THAT PROHIBIT ENTRANCE TO MINORS; AND

2	DETERMINES THAT THE INSTALLATION OF A DIAPER-CHANGING
3	FACILITY OR SIMILAR AMENITY IS NOT FEASIBLE.
