A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

The 2019-2020 Current Expense Budget Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund COVID-19 Donations Emergency Measure

FOR the purpose of amending the 2019-2020 Current Expense Budget, by appropriating to the Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund monies derived from anticipated donated funds that will be made available to the County and the acceptance of goods and services that may be donated as a result of the COVID-19 public health catastrophe and public safety emergency; requiring the creation of a certain log; requiring certain disclosure of the log; and providing for the effective date of this emergency measure.

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020 the County Council approved the continuation of a State of Emergency declared by the County Executive on March 13, 2020 (Executive Order No. 2020-002); and

WHEREAS, a Declaration of State of Emergency and Existence of a Catastrophic Health Emergency was declared by the Governor of the State of Maryland on March 5, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the President of the United States have declared the COVID-19 outbreak a public health emergency of international concern that poses an immediate danger to public safety; and

WHEREAS, as the COVID-19 public health catastrophe and public safety emergency continues, it threatens lives, health and property in Baltimore County, requiring Baltimore County to call all of its resources into limited or long-term activation; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Sections 306 and 712(b) of the Baltimore County

Charter and Section 10-6-102 of the Baltimore County Code, 2015, as amended, the County

Council may accept gifts and grants and may make emergency appropriations to meet a public emergency affecting life, health or property from revenues from anticipated sources; and

WHEREAS, such anticipated revenues will be appropriated to the Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund and expend same, said fund having been established solely for the purpose of accounting for certain monetary gifts and grants made available to the County for restricted purposes; and

WHEREAS, such fund remains open perpetually as a mechanism to account for the respective gift and grant appropriations and expenditures throughout the entire term of the grant period, including beyond the current expense budget fiscal year; and

WHEREAS Section 308(f) of the Baltimore County Charter provides that by the affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the total number of county council members established by the Charter any law or ordinance shall be declared an emergency measure affecting the public health, safety or welfare, in which event the same shall take effect from the date of enactment; now therefore

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE

COUNTY, MARYLAND, pursuant to the power and authority conferred upon it by Sections 306

and 712(b) of the Baltimore County Charter and Section 10-6-102 of the Baltimore County Code

2015, as amended, that the Current Expense Budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, be

and is hereby amended by appropriating funds made available through donations in the amount

herein specified, to the following program:

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SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that the Director of Budget and

Finance shall keep a log of all gifts and grants received under this Act containing, at a minimum,

(i) The identity and contact information, including address and telephone number, of the donor;

(ii) The date the donation was made; and (iii) the amount of the donation. If applicable, the log shall also contain: (i) the reason for making the gift to the county; and (ii) the office or

- 2 county. The log shall be disclosed to the County Council not later than 30 days after the end of
- 3 the local state of emergency.

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- 5 SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act having been passed by
- 6 the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, is declared an emergency measure
- 7 affecting the public health, safety or welfare and shall take effect from the date of enactment.
