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3	The County Council of Frederick County, Maryland, finds it necessary and appropriate to
4	add Article XIV: Domestic Violence Coordinating Council, Sections 1-2-400 through 1-2-406 to
5	the Frederick County Code in recognition that domestic violence affects the entire community and
6	in order to increase collaboration and communication to maximize resources to reduce and prevent
7	domestic violence in Frederick County.
8	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF
9	FREDERICK COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Frederick County Code be, and it is hereby,
10	amended as shown on the attached Exhibit 1.

Creation, Duties. 7 8 There shall be a Frederick County Domestic Violence Coordinating Council 9 (Coordinating Council). 10 11 (B) The Coordinating Council will meet at least 4 times each year. 12 13 (C) The Coordinating Council shall: 14 15 (1) Advise the County Executive, County Council, and Criminal Justice 16 Coordinating Commission and its members on policies, programs, and legislation necessary to 17 prevent domestic violence and assist victims and their families with safety, stability, and 18 services. 19 20 Promote and facilitate an effective community-wide victim-centered 21 response to domestic violence, including a well-coordinated, multi-disciplinary approach to all 22 programs serving victims of domestic violence and their families; 23 24 Coordinate with the Maryland Network Against Domestic Violence and 25 all other County, State, Federal, and non-governmental agencies, committees, boards, 26 commissions, and organizations that operate, monitor, provide education or technical assistance 27 or coordinate domestic violence programs or services in the County to maximize the 28 effectiveness of these programs and services; 29 30 (4) Develop recommendations to improve the coordination and effectiveness 31 of County, State, federal, and non-governmental multi-disciplinary, victim centered efforts regarding domestic violence, including prevention, intervention, treatment, law enforcement, 32 33 prosecution, correctional, and advocacy efforts; 34 35 (5) Cooperate with the any relevant departments, agencies, committees, 36 boards, commissions, and organizations to periodically review the quality and sufficiency of 37 programs and facilities available to domestic violence victims, offenders, and their children 38 throughout the County.

7	(7) Obtain and evaluate statistical data, reports, and other information related
8	to domestic violence, including information regarding innovative efforts by other governmental
9	and non-governmental entities, as necessary to implement the requirements of this section; and

11	(8) Subject to subsection §1-2-404, advocate or policies or legislation at the
12	County, State, and Federal levels that would improve efforts to address domestic violence issues,
13	including prevention, intervention, treatment, law enforcement, prosecution, correctional, and
14	advocacy efforts.

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18	(A) The Coordinating Council shall include the following:

20	(1) A member of the County Council;
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22	(2) The Administrative Judge for Frederick County District Court or designee
23	of the Administrative Judge;

25	(3) The Administrative Judge for the Frederick County Circuit Court or
26	designee of the Administrative Judge;
27	
28	(4) The State's Attorney for Frederick County or designee of the State's
29	Attorney;
30	
31	(5) The Regional Director of the Division of Parole and Probation, Maryland
32	Department of Public Safety and Corrections or designee of the Regional Director;
33	
34	(6) The Frederick County Sheriff or designee of the Frederick County Sheriff;
35	
36	(7) The Chief of the City of Frederick Police Department or designee of the
37	Chief;

39	(8) The Forensic Nursing Services Coordinator at Frederick Health Hospital
40	or designee of the Coordinator;
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1	(9) The President of a comprehensive domestic violence program serving
2	County residents, or designee of the President;
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5	(10) The Director of the Frederick County office of the Maryland Department
6	of Human Services or designee of the Director;

9	(11) The Director of Behavioral Health Services, Frederick County Health
10	Department, or designee of the Director;
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12	(12) The Superintendent of Frederick County Public Schools or designee of the
13	Superintendent;

15	(13) The Director of the Frederick County Child Advocacy Center or designee of
16	the Director.

18	(B) Subject to confirmation by the County Council, with input from the Coordinating
19	Council members listed in Section 1-2-401(A), the County Executive must appoint the following
20	individuals to serve 3-year terms on the Coordinating Council:
21	
22	(1) One (1) attorney with experience representing victims of domestic
23	violence to serve a 3-year term;
24	
25	(2) One (1) attorney with experience representing criminal defendants of

28	(3) One (1) member of the public with a demonstrated interest in domestic
29	violence issues, with preference for a survivor of domestic violence, to serve a 3-year term; and
30	
31	(4) One (1) student member with a demonstrated interest in addressing
32	domestic and dating violence to serve a 1-year term on the Coordinating Council. The student
33	member's term may be renewed for 1 additional year. The student member must be a high
34	school or college student who resides in the County when initially appointed.
35	
36	(C) All members of the Coordinating Council are voting members.
37	
38	(D) If the State's Attorney agrees, their office will provide the primary staff for the
39	Coordinating Council:
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4 1	(1) At the request of the State's Attorney, the State courts and agencies listed

1	in this section and the County agencies listed in this section may provide additional staff
2	assistance to the Coordinating Council.

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7	The Coordinating Council must elect a chair and vice-chair from among its members to
8	serve 2-year terms.
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10	<u>§1-2-403. Rules.</u>
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12	The Coordinating Council shall adopt rules to govern its procedures and activities.
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14	<u>§1-2-404. Advocacy.</u>
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16 17	The Coordinating Council as an entity may not engage in any advocacy efforts at the
18	local, State, or federal levels unless these efforts are approved by a majority of the members. This subsection does not bar individual members or represented agencies and organizations from
19	engaging in advocacy independent of the Coordinating Council.

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27	The Coordinating Council may make reports and recommendations to the County
28	Executive and County Council from time to time as the Coordinating Council finds appropriate
29	but must report annually.
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
