## AN EXPEDITED ACT to:

- (1) authorize the disposal of certain goods received in response to a declared emergency without competition;
- (2) require the disposal of goods in a declared emergency in accordance with emergency procedures and prioritization guidelines established by the public official declaring the emergency; and
- (3) generally amend the management and disposal of goods by the County.

The County Council for Montgomery County, Maryland, approves the following act:

1	Sec 1	. Section 11B-44 is amended as follows:
2	11B-44. Ma	anagement and disposal of goods.
3	(a)	The Director must ensure the management of goods during their entire
4		life cycle.
5	(b)	Except as provided in subsection (f), the [The] Director must dispose
6		of surplus goods. In disposing the surplus goods, the Director may sell
7		the goods by any competitive method which the Director determines is
8		likely to bring the highest return to the County. These methods may
9		include sealed bids, public auction, or trade in or exchange of goods.
10		The Director may sell surplus goods by private sale if the Director
11		determines that open competition is not likely to bring the highest return
12		to the County.
13	(c)	After public notice, the Chief Administrative Officer may give, loan, or
14		sell below fair market value, surplus goods to another public entity if
15		the Chief Administrative Officer determines the disposition would
16		benefit the residents of Montgomery County. Public notice may be
17		given through the Montgomery County Register.
18	(d)	If surplus goods have no resale or scrap value, the Director may dispose
19		of the goods in any responsible manner.
20	(e)	Notwithstanding any other provision of County law, any gun that is
21		surplus must be destroyed.
22	<u>(f)</u>	During a period when the County is under a state of emergency order
23		issued by the Federal, State, or County governments, the Director of the
24		Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security or the

33	The Council declares that this legislation is necessary for the immediate
34	protection of the public interest. This Act takes effect on the date on which it
35	becomes law and applies to any goods received by the County on or after March 5,
36	2020.
