(a) It sh	all be unla	wful for a p	latform to	o list a shor	t-term renta	l or for an	iy person

(1) Short-term rentals that rent, or offers to rent that unit or any portion thereof,										
by the hour or for a	ny period o	f fewer than 2	24 consec	utive hours;						

1	(2) Short-term rentals that rent, or offers to rent that unit or any portion thereof,
2	more than once within any consecutive 24-hour period measured from the commencement of one
3	rental to the commencement of the next;
4	(3) Advertise an hourly rate or any rate for any short-term rental period of fewer
5	than 24 consecutive hours;
6	(4) Short-term rentals that rents, offers to rent that unit or any portion thereof, for
7	multiple bookings or rentals for the same or overlapping time periods;
8	(b) [If any of the acts prohibited by this section occurs, the Director may:
9	(1) issue an administrative citation as that term is defined by Subtitle 13, Division
10	1, Subdivision 1 of this Code,
11	(2) issue a violation notice,
12	(3) suspend the platform's short-term rental license, or
13	(4) revoke the platform's short term rental license.] The platform short-term rental
14	license is a privilege and not a right. A platform short-term rental license may be suspended
15	or revoked at any time or not renewed based upon non-compliance with the requirements
16	of this Division and the Prince George's County Code.
17	(c) <u>A platform short-term rental license may be suspended or revoked due to a citation,</u>
18	corrective order, or violation notice citing violations of the Prince George's County Code.
19	(d) All enforcement actions and penalties are at the Director's discretion, based upon
20	the requirements of this Division.
21	[c] (e) If a platform collects a fee for booking services in connection with an unlicensed
22	host, the platform shall be liable and subject to civil fines of \$1,000 per violation. The civil fine
23	may be imposed through either a violation notice or an administrative citation.
24	[d] (f) If a platform collects a fee for booking services in connection with someone who
25	does not have a 90-day certificate from the Department regarding a filed and complete application,
26	the platform shall be liable and subject to civil fines of not less than \$1,000 per violation. The civil
27	fine may be imposed through either a violation notice or an administrative citation.
28	[e] (g) An administrative citation or violation notice issued pursuant to this Division shall
29	contain, at a minimum, all of the information required by Section 13-1125 of this Code and shall
30	be served in accordance with the provisions of that Section.
31	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby

declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining
words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections or sections of this
Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such
invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection
or section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
