(a) In the event that an owner does not comply with the remedial action set forth in a notice							
of violation within the time period provided (including any period allowed by appeal), and upon							
verification by the Director or the Director's designee that the violation still exists, the Director

13	(a) In general. The jurisdiction and authority of the Administrative Hearing Unit extends to						
14	each of the provisions of the Prince George's County Code that are specified in subsection (e) of						
15	this section, as those provisions may be amended, including any rules and regulations adopted						
16	under them. The issuance of an administrative citation does not preclude pursuit of any other						
17	remedy or enforcement action authorized by law.
