AN ACT establishing an Opioid Abatement Special Revenue Fund as a special, nonlapsing revenue fund, also known as a Local Abatement Fund, as provided in the State-Subdivision Agreement between the State of Maryland and Local Governments on Proceeds relating to the Settlement of Opioids Litigation; specifying the purposes, permitted uses, and nature of the fund; and generally related to finance, taxation, and budget.

11 **SECTION 20.1400. FUND ESTABLISHED; PURPOSE.**

12 (A) *FUND ESTABLISHED.* THERE IS AN OPIOID ABATEMENT SPECIAL REVENUE FUND,  
13 ALSO KNOWN AS A LOCAL ABATEMENT FUND, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE-  
14 SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE STATE OF MARYLAND AND LOCAL  
15 GOVERNMENTS ON PROCEEDS RELATING TO THE SETTLEMENT OF OPIOIDS  
16 LITIGATION.

17 (B) *PURPOSES.* THE PURPOSE OF THE OPIOID ABATEMENT SPECIAL REVENUE FUND IS  
18 TO RECEIVE AND SPEND PAYMENTS MADE TO THE COUNTY BY THE SETTLEMENT  
19 ADMINISTRATOR TO THE COUNTY UNDER THE NATIONAL SETTLEMENT  
20 AGREEMENT AND THE STATE-SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE STATE OF  
21 MARYLAND AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS ON PROCEEDS RELATING TO THE  
22 SETTLEMENT OF OPIOIDS LITIGATION, OR PURSUANT TO ANY OTHER OPIOID  
23 LITIGATION SETTLEMENT BY THE COUNTY. THE OPIOID ABATEMENT SPECIAL  
24 REVENUE FUND SHALL ALSO CONSIST OF INTEREST EARNINGS OF THE FUND.  
25 EXPENDITURES FROM THE OPIOID ABATEMENT SPECIAL REVENUE FUND MAY BE  
26 MADE ONLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE COUNTY BUDGET.

27 (C) *PERMITTED USES.* THE REVENUE PAID INTO THE OPIOID ABATEMENT SPECIAL  
28 REVENUE FUND SHALL BE USED AS PERMITTED BY THE NATIONAL SETTLEMENT  
29 AGREEMENT, SECTION 7-331(F) OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT  
30 ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND, ~~AND~~ THE STATE-SUBDIVISION  
31 AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE STATE OF MARYLAND AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS ON

7 GOVERNMENTS ON PROCEEDS RELATING TO THE SETTLEMENT OF OPIOIDS

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
