The use of reasonable physical force by sworn police officers is authorized in situations which	
cannot be otherw	ise controlled. The use of reasonable physical force is authorized when other

1 reasonable alternatives have been exhausted or would clearly be ineffective under the particular 2 circumstances. In no circumstance may the use of physical force be more than that which is 3 necessary to achieve a lawful purpose. Officers are permitted to use deadly force only when the officer reasonably believes that the use of deadly force is necessary in the defense of human life, 4 5 including the officer's own life, or in the defense of any person in immediate danger of serious 6 physical injury.] 7 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby 8 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, 9 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining 10 11 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this 12 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such 13 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, 14 or section. 15 SECTION 3.
