## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

Bring Your Own Bag Act

FOR the purpose of prohibiting, on or after a certain date, a retail establishment from distributing certain plastic carryout bags to a customer at the point of sale; establishing a minimum charge for certain paper and reusable carryout bags provided by a retail establishment; requiring certain signage be posted regarding certain charges for paper and reusable carryout bags; establishing a certain maximum civil penalty for a violation of this Act; establishing that the distribution of a certain number of plastic carryout bags at a single point of sale constitutes a single violation; prohibiting the imposition of a penalty under this Act unless certain conditions are met; providing for the enforcement of this Act; permitting the Department of Permits, Approvals, and Inspections to adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; providing for the applicability of the Act; and generally relating to one-time use carryout bags.

1	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
2	COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Laws of Baltimore County read as follows:

7	§ 21-14-101. DEFINITIONS.
8	(A) IN THIS TITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
9	INDICATED.
10	(B) "FOOD SERVICE FACILITY" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN $\S~21–301~\mathrm{OF}$
11	THE HEALTH – GENERAL ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND.
12	(C) (1) "PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG" MEANS A PLASTIC BAG THAT IS
13	PROVIDED BY A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT TO A CUSTOMER AT THE POINT OF
14	SALE AND IS NOT A REUSABLE CARRYOUT BAG.
15	(2) "PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG" INCLUDES A COMPOSTABLE PLASTIC
16	BAG THAT MEETS THE SPECIFICATIONS OF THE AMERICAN SOCIETY OF TESTING
17	AND MATERIALS INTERNATIONAL STANDARD SPECIFICATION FOR

19	(3) "PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG" DOES NOT INCLUDE:

7	OTHER DAMP ITEMS;

10	5. CONTAIN GARMENTS OR DRY-CLEANED CLOTHES,
11	INCLUDING SUITS, JACKETS, AND DRESSES; OR

19	CUSTOMERS AS A RESULT OF THE SALE OF A GOOD, PRODUCT, OR SERVICE
20	WHETHER FOR-PROFIT OR NOT-FOR-PROFIT.
21	(2) "RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT" INCLUDES A GROCERY STORE OR
22	SUPERMARKET, A GENERAL MERCHANDISE OR DEPARTMENT STORE, A
23	HARDWARE OR HOME IMPROVEMENT STORE, A SPECIALTY PRODUCTS STORE, A

1	PHARMACY STORE, A LIQUOR STORE, A JEWELRY STORE, A FLORIST OR
2	GALLERY, A CONVENIENCE STORE OR A FUEL OR SERVICE STATION WITH A
3	CONVENIENCE STORE, OR ANY OTHER RETAIL STORE OR VENDOR, INCLUDING A
4	TEMPORARY STORE OR VENDOR AT A STREET FAIR OR FESTIVAL.
5	(3) "RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT" DOES NOT INCLUDE A SMALL RETAIL
6	ESTABLISHMENT.
7	(E) "REUSABLE CARRYOUT BAG" MEANS A BAG WITH STITCHED HANDLES
8	THAT IS SPECIFICALLY DESIGNED AND MANUFACTURED FOR MULTIPLE REUSE
9	AND IS MADE OF:
10	(1) CLOTH OR OTHER WASHABLE FABRIC; OR
11	(2) A DURABLE MATERIAL SUITABLE FOR MULTIPLE RE-USE THAT
12	IS NOT MADE OF PLASTIC FILM EXCEPT FOR PLASTIC FILM THAT HAS A
13	THICKNESS GREATER THAN 2.6 MILS.
14	(F) (1) "SMALL RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT" MEANS A STORE, A FOOD
15	SERVICE FACILITY, OR ANY OTHER ESTABLISHMENT THAT PROVIDES BAGS TO
16	ITS CUSTOMERS AS A RESULT OF THE SALE OF A GOOD, PRODUCT, OR SERVICE
17	WHETHER FOR-PROFIT OR NOT-FOR-PROFIT THAT:
18	(I) OPERATES SOLELY IN BALTIMORE COUNTY OR ADJOINING
19	JURISDICTIONS;
20	(II) HAS THREE OR FEWER PHYSICAL LOCATIONS; AND
21	(III) IS NOT PART OF A FRANCHISE, CORPORATION,
22	CORPORATE CONTROL GROUP, OR PARTNERSHIP THAT HAS PHYSICAL
23	LOCATIONS OUTSIDE OF BALTIMORE COUNTY OR ADJOINING JURISDICTIONS.

1	(2) "SMALL RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT" DOES NOT INCLUDE A
2	LIQUOR STORE, A CONVENIENCE STORE, OR A FUEL OR SERVICE STATION WITH
3	A CONVENIENCE STORE.

5	§ 21-14-102. PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAGS PROHIBITED; PAPER AND REUSABLE
6	CARRYOUT BAG CHARGE.
7	(A) ON OR AFTER NOVEMBER 1, 2023, A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT MAY NOT
8	PROVIDE A PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG TO A CUSTOMER.
9	(B) (1) ON OR AFTER NOVEMBER 1, 2023, A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT
10	SHALL CHARGE, COLLECT, AND RETAIN AT LEAST 10 5 CENTS FOR EACH PAPER
11	CARRYOUT BAG AND REUSABLE CARRYOUT BAG THAT IT PROVIDES TO A
12	CUSTOMER. <u>A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT SHALL NOT CHARGE A CUSTOMER</u>
13	UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH WHO BRINGS THEIR OWN REUSABLE CARRYOUT BAG.
14	(2) (I) A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT MAY NOT ADVERTISE, HOLD
15	OUT, OR STATE TO THE PUBLIC OR TO A CUSTOMER, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY,
16	THAT REIMBURSEMENT OF ANY PART OF THE MONEY COLLECTED UNDER
17	PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION WILL BE ASSUMED OR ABSORBED BY THE
18	STORE OR REFUNDED TO THE CUSTOMER.
19	(II) NOTHING IN SUBPARAGRAPH (2)(I) OF THIS SUBSECTION
20	SHALL PROHIBIT A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT FROM OFFERING OR ADVERTISING
21	A PROMOTION OR PROGRAM THAT PROVIDES AN INCENTIVE TO CUSTOMERS TO
22	BRING THEIR OWN REUSABLE CARRYOUT BAG, OR REDUCES THE COST FOR
23	PURCHASING A REUSABLE CARRYOUT BAG, PROVIDED THAT NO PURCHASE IS

1	NECESSARY TO REDEEM THE OFFER OR PROMOTION AND NO REDUCTION IN
2	COST IS BELOW THE AMOUNT REQUIRED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
3	SUBSECTION.
4	(3) A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT SHALL INDICATE ON THE CUSTOMER
5	TRANSACTION RECEIPT THE NUMBER OF PAPER OR REUSABLE CARRYOUT BAGS
6	PROVIDED BY THE ESTABLISHMENT AND THE AMOUNT CHARGED.
7	(4) A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT SHALL MAY POST A SIGN AT EACH
8	POINT OF SALE SUCH THAT IT IS VISIBLE TO CUSTOMERS AND EMPLOYEES
9	DURING A TRANSACTION THAT STATES THE CHARGE FOR EACH PAPER
10	CARRYOUT BAG AND REUSABLE CARRYOUT BAG IT PROVIDES TO A CUSTOMER.
11	(C) A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT MAY NOT COLLECT A CHARGE REQUIRED
12	UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION FROM A CUSTOMER WHO USES STATE
13	OR FEDERAL SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS (SNAP), FOOD
14	COUPONS OR OTHER TYPE OF ALLOTMENT ISSUED UNDER 7 U.S.C. 2011-2036, OR
15	WITH FOOD INSTRUMENTS, FOOD VOUCHERS, OTHER TYPE OF CERTIFICATE
16	ISSUED UNDER 42 U.S.C. 1786 (SPECIAL SUPPLEMENTAL FOOD PROGRAM FOR
17	WOMEN, INFANTS, AND CHILDREN), OR WITH PANDEMIC ELECTRONIC BENEFIT
18	TRANSFER (P-EBT), FOR ANY PART OF THE TRANSACTION.
19	(C) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A SMALL RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT
20	
21	§ 21-14-103. PENALTY; NOTICE OF VIOLATION.
22	(A) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, A RETAIL
23	ESTABLISHMENT THAT VIOLATES § 21-14-102 OF THIS TITLE IS SUBJECT TO A

1	CIVIL PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING \$500.
2	(B) (1) (I) THE PROVISION OF ONE OR MORE PLASTIC CARRYOUT
3	BAGS AT A SINGLE POINT OF SALE IS A SINGLE VIOLATION.
4	(II) THE FAILURE TO CHARGE THE AMOUNT OF MONEY
5	REQUIRED UNDER § 21-14-102(B) OF THIS TITLE FOR THE PROVISION OF ONE OR
6	MORE PAPER OR REUSABLE CARRYOUT BAGS AT A SINGLE POINT OF SALE IS A
7	SINGLE VIOLATION.
8	(2) A PENALTY MAY NOT BE IMPOSED UNDER THIS SECTION UNLESS
9	A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT:
10	(I) IS FIRST ISSUED A WRITTEN NOTICE OF VIOLATION; AND
11	(II) DOES NOT CORRECT THE VIOLATION WITHIN 7 DAYS
12	AFTER RECEIPT OF THE WRITTEN NOTICE.
13	(3) A PENALTY MAY NOT BE IMPOSED ON A RETAIL
14	ESTABLISHMENT MORE THAN ONCE WITHIN A 7–DAY PERIOD.

16	§ 21-14-104. ENFORCEMENT; WAIVER; ANNUAL REPORT.
17	(A) THIS TITLE SHALL BE ENFORCED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
18	(B) THE DIRECTOR OR THEIR DESIGNEE MAY GRANT A RETAIL
19	ESTABLISHMENT UP TO TWO WAIVERS FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS TITLE
20	FOR A PERIOD OF UP TO 3 MONTHS FOR EACH WAIVER IF THE DIRECTOR
21	DETERMINES THAT ACHIEVING COMPLIANCE UNDER THIS TITLE WOULD CAUSE
22	THE RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT AN UNDUE HARDSHIP OR A PRACTICAL
23	DIFFICULTY NOT GENERALLY APPLICABLE TO OTHER RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS

1	IN SIMILAR CIRCUMSTANCES.
2	(C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE
3	COUNTY EXECUTIVE AND COUNTY COUNCIL THAT INCLUDES A LIST OF ALL
4	ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS TAKEN AND PENALTIES ISSUED UNDER THIS TITLE.
5	
6	§ 21-14-105. REGULATIONS.
7	THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS TITLE.
8	
9	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that the Department of Permits,
10	Approvals, and Inspections may not issue a citation with a monetary penalty for the first 90 days
11	after the provisions of § 21-14-102(a)-(b) take effect; however, during this period the
12	Department may issue a correction notice and shall attempt to educate any non-compliant retail
13	establishment on the requirements of this Act.
14	
15	SECTION 2 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by
16	the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect 14 days from the
17	date of enactment.
