AN ACT to propose an amendment to Article II, Legislative Branch, of the Harford County Charter, as amended, by repealing and re-enacting, with amendments, Section 206, Term of Council Members; to provide for term limits for County Council members; and to require the submission of this amendment to the legally qualified voters of Harford County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Section 905 of the Harford County Charter.

1 Section 1. Be It Enacted By The County Council of Harford County, Maryland, that Section 206,
2 Term of Council Members, of Article II, Legislative Branch, of the Harford County Charter, as
3 amended, be, and it is hereby, repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

4 **Article II. Legislative Branch**

5 **Section 206. Term of Council Members.** A Council member shall serve for a term beginning at
6 noon on the first Monday in December next following election, and ending noon on the first Monday
7 in December in the fourth year thereafter. NO PERSON ELECTED OR APPOINTED AS A
8 MEMBER OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR SUCCESSION IN THE
9 OFFICE OF COUNCIL MEMBER AFTER SERVING IN SUCH OFFICE FOR THREE
10 CONSECUTIVE FULL FOUR-YEAR TERMS. A MEMBER OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL,
11 HOWEVER, WHO WAS NOT THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT IS NOT PRECLUDED FROM
12 BEING ELECTED OR APPOINTED AS THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT AFTER HAVING SERVED
13 THREE CONSECUTIVE FULL FOUR-YEAR TERMS AS A COUNCIL MEMBER BUT IS NOT
14 ELIGIBLE FOR SUCCESSION IN THE OFFICE OF COUNCIL PRESIDENT AFTER SERVING
15 IN SUCH OFFICE FOR THREE CONSECUTIVE FOUR YEAR TERMS. IN DETERMINING
16 ELIGIBILITY PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION, NO TERM OR PART OF ANY TERM SERVED
17 PRIOR TO THE ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 3, 2026 SHALL BE USED IN CALCULATING
18 THE LIMITATION ON THE NUMBER OF TERMS A COUNCIL MEMBER MAY SERVE.


19 Section 2. And Be It Further Enacted that before this Act becomes effective, it shall be
20 submitted to a Referendum of the legally qualified voters of Harford County in accordance with
21 Section 905 of the Charter of Harford County, Maryland, at the General Election to be held in
22 November 2024. There shall be printed on the ballots or ballot labels used at this election a brief
23 summary in understandable language of the purpose of this Act, and underneath the summary, on
24 separate lines, a square or box to the right of and opposite the words “For__,” and a corresponding
25 square or box to the right of and opposite the words “Against__,” so that each voter may vote for or
26 against the provisions of this Act. If a majority of the votes cast in the election are “For__,” the
27 provisions of this Act shall become effective from and after the 30th calendar day following the
28 election, but if a majority of the votes cast in the election are “Against__,” the provisions of this Act

1 shall be of no effect and null and void.

2 Section 3. And Be It Further Enacted that subject to the provisions of Section 2 of this Act and for
3 the sole purpose of providing for the referendum therein required, this Act shall take effect 60 calendar
4 days from the date it becomes law.
