## AN **EXPEDITED** ACT to:

- (1) rename the Policing Advisory Commission so that it will now be known as [[Community Advisory Commission on Public Safety]] <u>Advisory Commission on Policing</u>;
- (2) amend the law regarding the Policing Advisory Commission regarding appointment of members and scope of the Commission; and
- (3) generally amend the law regarding policing and law enforcement.

Montgomery County Code Chapter 35 Sections 35-6 and 35-6A
