1	(D) The period of eligibility for this annual semiconductor incentive is ten (10)								
2	taxable years after the base year.								
3	(2) Only semiconductor production activities that occur after the initial effective date of								
4	this section are eligible costs for the semiconductor incentive.								
5	(3) An applicant awarded an incentive under this section shall enroll as a mentor in the								
6	County's mentor-protégé program as authorized under Subtitle 10A as a condition of award.								
7	(c) The Office of Finance shall administer this section, including establishing application								
8	and approval procedures. The County Executive may also designate other county agencies,								
9	offices, or departments (including quasi-public agencies) to assist the Office of Finance with the								
10	administration of this section.

12	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby								
13	declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,								
14	sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of								
15	competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining								
16	words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this								
17	Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such								
18	invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,								
19	or section.								
20	SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)								
21	calendar days after it becomes law.
