30	Sec. 2-211. Discrimination in Housing and Residential Real Estate-Related Transactions.									
31	(a) It shall be unlawful for any person or other entity whose business includes engaging in									

residential real estate-related transactions to discriminate against any person in making available such a transaction, or in the terms or conditions of such a transaction because of discrimination as enumerated in Section 2-210(a)(1). Real estate appraisal, the process used to determine, analyze, or assess the value of real property, is a residential real estate-related transaction under this section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that those found in violation of this Act shall be reported in writing by the County Office of Human Rights to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Office of Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity, the U.S. Department of Justice Civil Rights Division, and the Maryland Office of the Attorney General Civil Rights Division for further potential action.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that by January 1, 2024, the County Office of Human Rights shall engage in a public awareness campaign to inform residents about the prohibition against real estate appraisal bias and give direction about how to file a claim with the County Office of Human Rights for real estate appraisal bias.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
