SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland, That the Anne Arundel County Construction and Property Maintenance Codes Supplement, October 1, 2005 (as amended) read as follows:

CONSTRUCTION CODE

Chapter 1 Construction Code Administrative Provisions

Section 105 Permits

105.5.4 Permit extension. Upon written request filed with the Department prior to permit expiration, and if the Department finds that a hardship exists, the times set forth in section 105.5 may be extended for up to one additional year from the date of expiration. A permit that is extended is subject to a [[\$25.00]] \$50 fee. A renewed permit may not be extended.

105.5.5 Permit renewal. Upon written request filed with the Department no later than six months after permit expiration, and if the Department finds that a hardship exists, an expired permit may be renewed for up to one additional year from the date of expiration. A permit that is renewed is subject to a [[\$25.00]] \$50 fee. A permit that has been extended must comply with the Construction Codes adopted in Article 15 of the County Code at the time of the extension.

Section 108

Fees

108.1.1 Automatic adjustment of fees.

108.1.1.1 BEGINNING ON JULY 1, 2025, AND ON EACH JULY 1 THEREAFTER, ALL FEES IN THIS CONSTRUCTION CODE SHALL BE AUTOMATICALLY ADJUSTED BASED ON THE METHODOLOGY SET FORTH IN THIS SUBSECTION, AND THE ADJUSTED FEES SHALL BE POSTED ON THE COUNTY'S WEBSITE.

108.1.1.2 THE BASE FOR COMPUTING AN ADJUSTMENT IS THE EMPLOYMENT COST INDEX FOR TOTAL COMPENSATION, FOR STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT WORKERS (NOT SEASONALLY ADJUSTED, FOR 12 MONTHS ENDING MARCH OF THAT YEAR) PUBLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS (THE "INDEX"). ALL FEES SHALL BE ADJUSTED BY THE PERCENTAGE OF INCREASE IN THE INDEX

108.1.1.3 IF THE BASE YEAR FOR THE INDEX IS CHANGED, ADJUSTMENTS SHALL BE MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONVERSION FACTOR PUBLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS. IF THE INDEX IS DISCONTINUED OR REVISED, ADJUSTMENTS SHALL BE BASED ON THE INDEX OR COMPUTATION WITH WHICH IT IS REPLACED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS.

108.2 Schedule of permit fees. On buildings, structures, electrical, gas, mechanical, and plumbing systems or alterations requiring a permit, a fee for each permit shall be paid as required, in accordance with the schedule as established by the applicable governing authority. A [[\$25.00 dollar]] \$43 nonrefundable permit application fee will be assessed for all permits.

108.2.1.4 Investigation fees. Whenever work for which a permit or application for inspection is required under the Construction Code has been commenced without issuance of a permit or request for inspection, an investigation shall be made before a permit or request for inspection may be issued for the work. In addition to the regular permit fee, an investigation fee of [[\$40]] \$150 shall be collected. The payment of the investigation fee may not exempt a person from compliance with the provisions of the Construction Code or from any penalty prescribed by law.

108.2.2.1 Application Fee. A [[\$25.00]] \$43 nonrefundable application fee shall be assessed for all soil percolation tests.

108.2.3 Electrical permit fees. The fees set forth in section 108.2.3 shall be paid to the County for an electrical permit and for the specified inspection services, except that if the total permit fee calculated for additions, alterations, or repairs to existing structures or services exceeds the comparable fee for new construction, the fee calculated for new construction shall be paid.

108.2.4 Fuel gas permit fees. A gasfitting permit fee for gas fuel-burning equipment shall be paid to the County according to the pipe size as follows:

A gasfitting permit fee is based on the size of the gas pipe leading from the gas meter in the building, the service gas pipe entering a building, or the gas pipe leading from an existing gas service pipe inside of a building. The gasfitting permit fee based on the size of the pipe supplying the system shall cover, without additional cost, one or more gas burning appliances supplied with gas from the pipe. An inspection fee of [[\$100]] \$173 or [[\$20]] \$34 per unit, whichever is greater, shall be paid to the County for onsite gas installations.

108.2.5 Mechanical permit fees. A permit fee for residential uses including one- and two-family and multifamily dwellings shall be paid to the County as follows:

108.4.1 Refund for unissued permit. Prior to building permit issuance, a 50% refund may be issued. [[The maximum amount retained by the County may not exceed \$1,000.]]

PERMIT APPLICATION FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE.

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108.5.1 Transfer of electrical, plumbing, mechanical, and fuel gas permits. A fee of [[\$25]] \$43 shall be paid to the County for transfer of a trade electrical, plumbing, mechanical, or fuel gas permit. A person licensed under Article 11 of the County Code may not apply for an electrical, plumbing, mechanical, or fuel gas permit or commence work for which another person licensed under Article 11 was issued a permit unless the original licensee has withdrawn or been removed from the work and has notified the Department in writing. Letters of explanation from the person for whom the work is to be performed or from either or both licensees shall be sent to the Code Official explaining the circumstances. If an electrical, plumbing, mechanical, or fuel gas contractor who signed an application for an electrical, plumbing, mechanical, or fuel gas permit dies, the permit shall be held in abeyance from the date of death. The extent of the work satisfactorily completed by the deceased shall be recorded on the Inspector's record and on the permit. If the owner decides to have the remainder of the work done, the original permit shall be reactivated on written request of the owner. The electrical, plumbing, mechanical, or fuel gas contractor who is to complete the work shall sign the original electrical, plumbing, mechanical, or fuel gas application on file at the Department and shall be held responsible for the work completed.

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109.15 Re-inspection fee.

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109.15.1 THERE IS A FEE OF \$150 FOR RE-INSPECTION FOR EACH REQUESTED INSPECTION THAT IS NOT CANCELED AT LEAST 24 HOURS PRIOR TO THE SCHEDULED INSPECTION OR WHICH IS NOT ACCESSIBLE TO THE INSPECTOR.

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109.15.2 There is a fee of [[\$40]] \$150 for re-inspection for each requested inspection which is not ready for inspection.

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Section 110

Certificate of Occupancy

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110.5 Fee for certificate of occupancy. If a permittee or property owner allows occupancy prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy, a penalty of [[\$500]] \$1,000 shall be paid to the County prior to a final inspection and the issuance of the certificate of occupancy.

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SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as follows:

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16-3-207. Fees; refunds.

(a) **Fees.** The fees set forth in the chart in this subsection apply to all grading permits other than those issued for work on property owned or leased and developed by the County or the Board of Education.

(B) Review and automatic adjustment of fees.

(1) BEGINNING ON JULY 1, 2025, AND ON EACH JULY 1 THEREAFTER, ALL FEES SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION SHALL BE AUTOMATICALLY ADJUSTED BASED ON THE METHODOLOGY SET FORTH IN THIS SUBSECTION.

(2) THE BASE FOR COMPUTING AN ADJUSTMENT IS THE EMPLOYMENT COST INDEX FOR TOTAL COMPENSATION, FOR STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT WORKERS (NOT SEASONALLY ADJUSTED, PERCENT CHANGE FOR 12 MONTHS ENDED MARCH OF THAT YEAR) PUBLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS (THE "INDEX"). ALL FEES SHALL BE ADJUSTED BY THE PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE INDEX ROUNDED TO THE NEAREST DOLLAR.

(3) IF THE BASE YEAR FOR THE INDEX IS CHANGED, ADJUSTMENTS SHALL BE MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONVERSION FACTOR PUBLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS. IF THE INDEX IS DISCONTINUED OR REVISED, ADJUSTMENTS SHALL BE BASED ON THE INDEX OR COMPUTATION WITH WHICH IT IS REPLACED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS.

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H(b)H-C) Refunds. On request of the applicant, the Department may refund 50% of a permit fee if for any reason the permit is not issued. [[The maximum amount retained by the County may not exceed \$1,000.]] Application fees are nonrefundable.

II(c)|| (D) Site improvements covered by a Public Works Agreement (PWA). Site improvements covered by a PWA are not included in grading and erosion control costs and fee calculations.

TITLE 5. VIOLATIONS, ENFORCEMENT, AND PENALTIES

16-5-102. Enforcement.

(E) Investigation fee. THERE IS A FEE OF \$150 FOR EACH INVESTIGATION BY THE DEPARTMENT THAT REVEALS A VIOLATION OF ANY PROVISION OF THIS ARTICLE.

ARTICLE 17. SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT

TITLE. 11 FEES AND SECURITY

17-11-101. Fees and security.

The following fees shall be paid and security given as provided in the following chart, except that fees paid on an application governed by the law as it existed prior to May 12, 2005, shall be credited against the fees in the following chart if the application is withdrawn and a new application is filed under this article:

SECTION 3. And be it further enacted, That, by January 1, 2026, and each January 1 every two years thereafter, the Department of Inspections and Permits shall provide a report to the County Council calculating the fees set forth in the Construction Code and § 16-3-207 of the Code (rounded to the nearest dollar) if those fees were adjusted by the Employee Cost Index for Total Compensation, for State and Local Government Workers (not seasonally adjusted, percent change for 12 months ended March of that year) published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

SECTION 3. 4. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect October 1, 2024.
