WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Office of Central Services contracted with MGT Consulting Group to conduct a Prince George's County Utilization and Availability Study ("County Disparity Study"), released in December of 2019, which assessed racial and ethnic disparities between availability and outcomes in public and private sector opportunities in Prince George's County from 2010 to 2018; and

WHEREAS, Recommendation (H) of the County Disparity Study encourages the County to partner with third parties to improve the capacity of small, minority, and women owned firms.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 10-366 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION. DIVISION 29. PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY SMALL BUSINESS CAPITAL AND GROWTH STIMULUS PROGRAM

Sec. 10-366. Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Program.

There is a Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Program consisting of the Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Fund and the programs set forth under this Section. All funding set forth under this Section is limited to monies appropriated in the County Budget. Total assistance from the Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Fund in any fiscal year for a business shall not exceed \$250,000 and any award is a non-renewable award.

- (a) Definitions.
 - (1) <u>Locally-Owned and Operated Business, in this Division, shall have the same</u> meaning as defined in Section 10A-101(a)(24.1) of this Code.
 - (2) <u>Local Start-Up Business in this Subtitle means a business based in Prince</u>
 <u>George's County and in operation for 36 months or less.</u>
- (b) [(a)]Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-Up Grant Program.
 - (1) The Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-Up Grant Program is hereby established as a program in which the County shall annually award grants

27	(f) [(e)] Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Fund is					
28	hereby established as a non-lapsing fund from which the County shall provide funding

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the County Executive and County Council shall in writing reevaluate and reconsider the need of the Act to address disparities in opportunities for businesses that are located within the beltway, with the goal of servicing at least fifty-percent (50%) of African-American businesses, within the next five (5) years or at the time of the next County Disparity Study, whichever occurs earlier.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
