SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,	
Maryland, that Section 13-147 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby	
repealed and reen	acted with the following amendments:

DIVISION 3. LANDLORD TENANT REGULATIONS.	
SUBDIVISION 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS.	
Sec. 13-147 Expiration and Notice of Expiration.	
This Act expires, and has no further force or effect, [one-year after the effective date of this	
Act] as of October 17, 2024 [without] unless further action is taken by the County Council [or	

the County Executive]. DPIE and DHCD must post on their respective websites information about the requirements of this Subdivision and the related Sections, including the date that these requirements expire.

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SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that in accordance with the provisions of Section 317 of the Charter, the County Council hereby declares that a public emergency exists affecting the public health, safety, and welfare; said emergency being the threat of homelessness due to a lack of affordable housing.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect on the date it becomes law.
